# Weatherspoon Weathers Obstacles to Excel in Track

Alexis Weatherspoon has conquered her biggest obstacles even before stepping into the starting blocks in 100 and 200 meters in the state track and field championships at Cerritos College today.

The junior from Grant High in Van Nuys is fortunate to be even running let alone walking.

Weatherspoon was born with a severely deformed left foot, which protruded outward. She wore orthopedic shoes for a year as an infant to straighten her foot and allow her to walk normally. Weatherspoon has also overcome a childhood battle with epilepsy and had surgery for hernia. In addition, Weatherspoon has asthma.

Weatherspoon pushed the maladies aside to win the 100 and 200 meters in the 1999 City meet. This season, she ranks among the state's best with marks of 11.79 and 24.64. She has also added the long jump and triple jump to her repertoire.

"I can't say I am a walking time bomb, but more like dice," Weatherspoon said. "I am unpredictable. I never know what's going to turn up next."

Particularly her sophomore season. The 5-5 Weatherspoon, who earned All-City honors playing on the Lancers' basketball team, missed nearly three weeks of training with sore knees after jumping into track.

Weatherspoon was also slowed by another hernia, which is unrelated to the one suffered as a child. The condition has limited her training and may require surgery if she overexerts herself. She has also had a long bout with the flu.

Antelope Valley College sprints coach James Harvey, a family friend who serves as a training consultant, said Weatherspoon workouts last season were limited to mostly drills and she has been unable to do any speedwork because of her maladies. There were also times when Weatherspoon came

close to quitting and broke out into tears because the pain was so great.

"When Alexis says she is in pain, you know she is really hurting," Harvey said. "She has a heart as big as a stadium. What she has been through has been pretty traumatic. We just tried to get through the season without getting hurt. If she got the starting line at the state meet and does not run a single step, she will be happy. That's more than we've asked for."

Weatherspoon's older brother John, 23, also suffered from epilepsy but her younger sister and brother are unaffected. Doctors are unsure of the cause of John and Alexis' epilepsy but hypothesize it may be caused by a lack of oxygen at birth.

Alexis, who was diagnosed in the first grade, has never lost conscious-

ness but suffered mild seizures which caused mental lapses during classes and conversations. She took medication for five years and her seizures appear to be in remission.

A relapse, however, is still in the back of Weatherspoon's mind, particularly with the death of Florence Griffith-Joyner, who suffered from a similar condition and died in her sleep during a seizure.

"I don't want that to be the only thing I have in common with FloJo," Weatherspoon said. "I just space out and stare into space and the next thing I know I would miss a whole lesson in class. Teachers thought I was not paying any attention. When I was talking to people, I wouldn't remember anything they said."

Still, Weatherspoon has been a model student at Grant. Weatherspoon maintains a 3.8 grade-point average and was nominated by the Grant faculty to serve as a liaison for the technology and communication magnet to improve communication between students and teachers.

Weatherspoon is an accomplished jazz and ballet dancer, pianist and violinist and also participated in gymnastics and swimming as a child.

Her uncle is actor John Weatherspoon, who plays "Pops" on the Wayans Bros. television show. Her father Ronald is a songwriter who has written compositions for Diana Ross and the Temptations.

Her mother Loretta knows the risk of Weatherspoon's involvement in sports with epilepsy, asthma and hernia but encouraged her daughter to go out for track as a Grant freshman. In her first season of track Weatherspoon finished second in the 100 in the City championships to earn a state-meet berth.

"I worry about her physical condition but she is a competitor and you have to realize what is going to happen is going to happen," her mother said. "You can't sit away and let life pass you by."

# Californian's Dominate National High School Records in Track and Field

California is truly the "Golden State" when it comes to performances on athletic fields, gyms, pools and other athletic facilities across the state. The National High School Record Book will attest to this. The book is jam-packed with great performances and records by California athletes in a variety of sports.

In the sport of track and field, California athletes are especially well-represented. California girls tracksters hold 10 of 17 national high school records. Seven of those have been accomplished in the 1990's.

Marion Jones, who competed at both Rio Mesa Oxnard High and Thousand Oaks High in her fabulous high school career, owns two of those records. Jones is the national record setter in the 100 meters (11.14) and the 200 meters (22.67).

Besides Jones, other California greats who have a place in the national record book include: Denean Howard of Kennedy Granada Hills, who holds the national mark in the 400 meters (52.39). Howard has the oldest national record in the books for a California girl athlete setting the standard in 1982. One year later, in 1983, Fullerton Union graduate Natalie Kaaiawahia set the national record in the shot put (53-7 3/4).

Mills High standout Leslie Maxie continued the trend in 1984 setting the national mark in the 300-meter low hurdles (40.18). It was seven years before another Californian would enter the record books when Juliana Yendork from Walnut High, set a national record in the triple jump (44-0 1/2) in 1991.

Suzy Powell of Downey Modesto joined the list with a best discus toss of 188-4 in 1994. Then Thousand Oaks High School added another star to the list when Kim Mortensen eclipsed the

national mark in the 3200 meters (9:48.59) in 1996.

On the team side, St. Bernard Playa del Rey and Long Beach Wilson both broke marks held by California schools. St. Bernard broke the 400 meter relay record with a time of 44.70 in 1997. The following year, Long Beach Wilson set a new national record in the 1600 meter relays (3:36.32).

Boys track athletes have also fared well nationally, holding seven national records and many second and third best national marks.

Calvin Harrison of North Salinas set a national record of 45.25 in the 400 meters, the only national record for boys in any state during the 1993 season. Charles Mayfield of Muir High, has held onto the national record in the triple jump (52-10 1/2) since 1980.

Lompoc's George Porter set the standard in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles (35.32) in 1985. That same year, Hawthorne set the team mark in the 1600 meter relays with a sizzling 3:07.40.

In 1986 Eric Mastalir of Jesuit High set the new national mark in the 3200 meter run at 8:44.95. James Stallworth of Tulare set the national mark in the long jump in 1989 at 26-4 3/4.

The newest boys' national mark came in 1996 when Bell Gardens standout Michael Granville bested Pete Richardson's (Berkeley High) long-time record in the 800 meters. Richardson set the mark of 1:47.31 in 1981, but Granville beat that with a time of 1:46.45.

As the old saying goes, records are made to be broken. Californians take this to heart.

## Figures to Have Plenty of Excitement

### Henderson, Perkins Square off in 400 Meters


NORWALK — Long considered home to America's premier female prep talent, the Golden State has really outdone itself this spring! As proof, a pair of Southern Californians have set national records in the same event in recent weeks, a third athlete had seriously threatened knocking off another national mark, and the area now boasts the national record holders in the distance medley relay as well as the strongest collection of 1,600-meter baton units in U.S. history. In fact, Californians hold down this season's nation-leading marks in nine of the sixteen girls' events!

Athletes on the boys' side aren't actually dragging their heels either, not with one red-hot distance star flirting with four-minute four-lappers in recent outings, a triumvirate of pole vaulters as good as any in the country and national-class sprinters just starting to rev into high gear for their own assault on the all-time standards.

Teamwise, the battle for state plaques projects to J.W. North of Riverside having a slight edge over Berkeley for the girls' crown, with Moore League rivals Long Beach Wilson and Long Beach Poly in hot pursuit.

For the boys, a wide-open affair is on tap, with Serra (Gardena) and Rancho Bernardo (San Diego Section) having the slight edge, although Long Beach Poly, Taft and Gahr are other serious contenders.

So sit back and enjoy the next two days of action as the 81st edition of the CIF-State Track and Field Championships roll into town to take center stage

at Cerritos College, promising a slew of exceptional season-ending performances by an estimated 900 scholar/athletes representing 300-plus schools.

Here's a look at the some of the top names and stories to look for, starting with the girls' events:

Nothing elicits excitement from a track crowd and produces more breathtaking drama than the speed events, with this year's collection of dashers sure to achieve that effect at "record" levels. Leading the way are San Diego Morse's Monique Henderson and Cerritos Gahr's Angel Perkins, a pair of one-lap standouts who have combined to twice rewrite

the record books in recent weeks. Perkins kicked off the postseason theatrics with a 52.28 clocking to set the National Federation Record at the Southern Section Division I finals, but it lasted only seven days as Henderson smashed it by smoking the track for a 51.31 as part of the greatest single-day sprint effort in national history (to go along with a 23.70 for 200, 11.88 for 100, and 51.8 anchor for the long relay). Now Henderson aims to gain revenge for her setback to Perkins in the prestigious Arcadia Invitational. Can these two one-lap wonders crack into "50-point" turf? Yikes !!!

As talented as Henderson and Perkins are, neither might be the favorite at the 200 distance, where Berkeley's Aisha Margain holds camp. The Yellowjackets senior scorched the tartan straightaway for a lifetime-best (11.63) in the 100 last week, already having powered her way to a wind-aided 23.10 (national best under any conditions) in the deuce earlier this spring!

Henderson went 23.70 last week, wtih Perkins checking in at 23.73, making this a potential lean-at-the-finish-line affair! Margain is the favorite in the 100 in the race for team points under the 10-8-6-4-2-1 scoring system for the top six places, with Centennial's Tiffany Bennett (11.69) and L.A. Grant's Alexis Weatherspoon (11.77 after a season-opening injury) among the leading challengers.

Despite J.W. North's DQ in the short relay last week (they were the year's national leader at 45.30), the relays promise to be a pair of sizzling affairs. Margain, Katrina Keith, Simone Brooks and T'Carra Pennick lead Berkeley (46.13), which looks to

get its state team-title bid off on the right track. James Logan (46.77) and Long Beach Wilson (46.78) are also in the running for the top spot. The meet-ending long relay could be even more exciting, where J.W. North (3:39.46) and Long Beach Wilson (3:39.64) helped produce the fastest race in national history as two squads eclipsed 3:40 in the same race for the first time ever! Poly (3:45.04) and Berkeley (3:47.50) also lurk closely in the rear-view mirror.

The hurdling events should be a pair of blazing affairs, with Long Beach Wilson's Lashinda Demus and J.W. North's Nichole Denby ranking as this year's national leaders and among the best in prep history in their specialties! Demus, the third-fastest low hurdler in U.S. annals (40.44 last year), appeared on her way to taking down Californian Leslie Maxie's national mark (40.19) last week, but she chopped her strides and struck the final hurdle hard to keep the longtime standard at bay at least another week. Denby, with a nation-leading 13.41 to her credit in the highs (the #11 time in U.S. history), ran 13.92 to get here today, sensational considering the third hurdle flight was placed in the wrong location last week, altering the steps and the rhythm of the entire Southern Section field in that one early on. As indication of Denby's stellar effort, she left runner-up Demus 1.37 seconds behind in the official results. Other leading barrier negotiators to keep tabs on include Oak Grove's Tamara Gulley (13.87) and Woodland Hills Taft's Deneeka Torrey (13.76w, 42.79) and Undine Becker (14.43, 43.28).

San Lorenzo Valley's Alejandra Barrientos has been downright awesome this spring, with nation-leading marks of 2:09.35, 4:46.60 and 10:11.19 to her credit, punctuated by a 4:44.5 split for 1,600 on the school's national record-setting distance medley relay jaunt (11:41.28 for her, younger sister Raquel Barrientos, Lindsay Scarborough


and Shiloh Whiting) in sending the Franklin Field crowd at the fabled Penn Relays into a frenzy. She and Montgomery's Sara Bei (sub-4:57 and sub-10:35 indoor for one and two miles, respectively), a two-time qualifier for the cross country nationals, are headed for a grueling double this weekend, with the latter fresh off a seasonal-best 4:49.09 clocking at her section finals. Glendale Hoover's Anita Siraki (10:18.61) is aiming for the upset in the 3,200, although some might consider her the favorite considering her slew of top efforts, having just one event to focus on, and being under the tutelage of standout coach Greg Switzer (has any California coach produced more top-level individuals in the distances?) provide a lethal combination. Keep an eye on Mira Costa frosh Lynn Dixon (4:50.05), the nation's newest distance find, and seasoned Newport Harbor junior Amber Steen (4:50.75, 10:52.32).

Although Barrientos won't be in the two-lap race, Corona del Mar's Liz Morse and Vallejo's Spring Dawson should provide fans with quite a treat. Morse went 2:08 and change indoors against an open field to kick off the year, with an outdoor best 2:09.40 while weathering a grueling schedule (she keyed a CIF-SS Division III title for the Sea Queens with an amazing quadruple!). Dawson (2:09.36) clipped more than three seconds off her personal best last week, giving the ultra-tough Morse (also 24.80 and 55.89) something to think about as this clash plays itself out. Shannon Rowbury of Sacred Heart Cathedral (San Francisco) has posted a 2:10.89 to loom among the top challengers.

Temple City's Laura Chen has been the pole vaulter to beat all season, with five meet records to her credit thus far. But while Chen's clearance of 12-3 tops the state for 2000 (a mere inch off the state record for juniors set by Golden West's Brooke

Lankard in 1997), Birmingham's Melissa Astete (12-2 1/4) t claim the LA City Section crown and Long Beach Poly's Jaimi Kolar (12-0) also have their sights fixated on a championship flight pattern. Rachel Zieman (Edison, Huntington Beach) came through with a huge four-inch improvement in the high jump at the SS Masters Meet last weekend, joining Central Coast Section titlist Jenna Grimaldi (St Ignatius) with 5-10 qualifying marks coming in. Among others in the picture for the top spot are 5-9 jumpers Chaunte Howard of J.W. North and Sharon Day of Costa Mesa, and Ziemann's twin sister Bianca (5-8).

No less than six athletes have successfully soared 19 feet thus far in the long jump under wind-legal conditions, headed by Elzunia Lamb of San Benito (19-11 3/4). Although ranking as the favorite, Lamb's task is made tougher by the recent emergence of Mission Viejo's Dana Bethel (including a seasonal-best 19-1), the continued progress of frosh phenom Michelle Sanford of Woodbridge (19-3 and the daughter of USC sprint recordholder James Sanford) and Sac-Joaquin

Section winner Jimia White of Casa Roble (19-5). Blessing Ufodiamma (41-1 3/4) has mastered the triple jump in recent years, but the Long Beach Poly star has found company in the 40-foot ranks at championship time as Laguna Creek's Lauren Chestnut extended for a 41-0 measurement last time out and Gahr's Nicole Duhart (40-4 1/2) has joined that select group under windy conditions.

A great clash ensues in the shot put, where San Luis Obispo junior Karen Freberg took over the national lead in the event with a heave of 50-10 1/4 at League Finals, with #2 nationally Jill Camarena of Woodland just a half-inch short of eclipsing the 50-foot barrier at the Arcadia Invitational. A third athlete on the radar screen is Jessica Cosby of Cleveland (Reseda), who posted a lifetime best 48-6 1/4 at Arcadia. Jill Camarena looks to cap a stellar senior campaign, with the Woodland High star having a 161-9 toss to her credit thus far. Her top challenger should be San Diego Hoover's Candace Hill (151-9), with Michelle Daggs (149-4 for Oakland Bishop O'Dowd) and Krissy Schelir (149-3 at Sierra Tollhouse) among the other top entrants.

Ryan Hall has captured the imagination of the Golden State's distance runners in recent weeks to highlight the boys' events coming in, with the Big Bear junior coming down from the mountain to repeatedly humble solid competition with seeming ease. Reportedly under the tutelage of Irv Ray (coach of American mile recordholder Steve Scott), Hall has dazzled Southland fans in recent weeks with Division IV record clockings of 4:05.78 and 4:05.01 for the 1,600 and 9:02.57 for the 3,200. Hall has dropped the four-lap battle from his agenda this week, opting to focus on the 3,200 for strength work in preparation for his anticipated showdown with Virginian Alan Webb (3:59.9 relay split for 1,600) at the National Scholastic Out-





door Championships in two weeks. Can you say 4-minute mile? Although going unchallenged in recent weeks, Hall won't have it easy this weekend with Ventura standout Josh Spiker (8:56.66 in 1999) having rebounded admirably from leg surgery to join Buchanan's Fernando Cabada (8:59.08 in '99) and San Diego Ramona's Matt McInvale (9:05.50) as leading entrants. Keep an eye on Southern Section underclassmen Tom Kubler of Viewpoint (peaking nicely for a 9:16.98 PR last week) and Cate's Henry Hagenbuch (9:17.39), among the nation's hottest sophomores!

With Hall and the Wisconsin-bound Spiker out of the mix for the 1,600, who'll step up to challenge Arizona State-signed ace Ryan Bousquet of Esperanza? It could be a pair of multilappers from Santee West Hills. Evan Fox, the CIF State Scholar-Athlete of the Year award winner (see page 8), braved warm weather to win San Diego Section honors in a personal best 4:10.84, with teammate Ben Aragon (4:12.08) right on his tail. Jin Daikoku (4:12.63), the San Francisco Section champ, and LA City titlist Sergio Campos (4:13.63) are also

in the title mix. The race at 800 meters might be a rematch of last week's San Diego Section affair, where Sean Rancho Bernardo's Sean Ricketts (1:52.69), Vista's Jared Emmons (1:53.13) and Poway's Aaron Powell (1:53.16) handled the spotlight in grand fashion, leaving a pair of sub-1:54 competitors out of the qualifying. Tustin's Alonso Smith had been the state leader over the last month after his 1:52.87 win at the Orange County Championships, looking to regain the top spot here. Chris Wells-Anders (1:53.00) of El Camino Real (Los Angeles) is another top entry.

After having laid low for most of this season, Albert Hollis (Christian Brothers, Sacramento) really rolled to the sprints forefront with a wind-aided 10.29 clocking his last time out, making the "dash clash" with Long Beach Poly's Bennie Robinson and Gardena Serra's Warren Rogers among the most anticipated matchups of the week. Hollis, whose imposing frame befits his gridiron presence, is in a groove (also 21.06 for the deuce last week), but Robinson (10.41, 21.13) has big Arcadia and Masters Meet wins to his credit while Rogers (10.34, 20.88) sports the best lifetime marks among the trio.

Fred Williams (21.12 for Woodland Hills Taft) and Rodney Landingham (10.49 for Sonora) are others to watch.

Jason Lovell (Cleveland, Reseda) sports the state's fastest time in the one-lap sprint (47.43), but the experience harbored by Chino's Travon Walton (47.09 last year), Gahr's Robert Nunn (47.59) and Riverside Notre Dame's Derrick Johnson (47.74) make this race anyone's guess. The relays could depend largely upon the health of Serra's Rogers. He's been nursing a tender hamstring in recent weeks, but the Cavaliers stunned their opposition with 41.22 and 3:13.72 Masters Meet wins without their main gun in the lineup last week! But DQs are always a major risk factor in these events (just ask L.B. Poly's unit, which was booted out of the divisional prelims), so look for such speed factories as University City (41.18), Gahr (41.38, 3:15.55), L.B. Poly (3:14.40) and Cleveland (41.39, 3:16.06) to be caught in a no-room-for-error race to the wire!

The presentation of the boys team-title plaques might hinge on what happens in the hurdle events, where Serra's Steven Smith, the state's most-improved hurdler in recent weeks (dropping almost two seconds in the intermediates to 37.50) locks up with Rancho Bernardo's Bobby Salimi (lifetime bests of 37.27 and 14.08 in sweeping the San Diego-area titles) head on. Both their teams are in serious contention for the team title. In either case, Smith and Salimi must contend with versatile wunderkind Trevor Jones of Newport Harbor and blazer Chris Morgan of Taft (Woodland Hills). The UCLA-bound Jones, whose name appears on the California "top marks" lists with mind-boggling frequency, boasts the state-leading mark in the intermediates (37.08) and has gone 14.21 in the highs. Morgan is the favorite in the highs after scorching the straightaway for a state-leading 13.94 clocking in winning the Arcadia Invitational.

Aerialists take center stage in the field events, where a trio of Californians are ranked on the top seven in the national pole vault lists this year! Marina senior Logan Odden leads the way, having cleared an Orange County record 16-7 at the Mt. Carmel Invitational in late April. The mark ranks third nationally this spring, with Verdugo Hills' Shane Hackett (sixth at 16-4) and Mt. Carmel's Travis Offner (seventh at 16-2) also regarded as models of consistency in this nerve-racking event! Palmdale's Jerrick Holmes is the only seven-footer in the high jump field (clearing that precise height at an early-season meet), but Ebon Glenn (St. Mary's Berkeley) ranks as the hottest entrant after last week's 6-11 mark at sectionals. Four others in the field have cleared 6-10, meaning keen strategy in choosing an entering height and total misses might play a major role in determining final places. Another interesting story to keep tabs on is the performance of Camarillo junior Chadd Smith, who has chosen to brave through the final months of the season while postponing his surgery for torn knee cartilage.

Royal's Oliver Jackson rode a sensational series of efforts at last month's Ventura County Championships to claim the state long jump lead, capping his day with a wind-legal effort measured at 24-5 3/4. But with Lincoln's (Stockton) Brandon Parker soaring a seasonal-best 24-3 1/2 last week, state-meet veteran Tony Allmond (St. Paul, Santa Fe Springs) stretching out to 24-4, and all-around talent Matt Ware (Student Sports Magazine's top-rated junior in football) of Loyola, this should be a great competition! The triple jump appeared to be wide open a few weeks ago, but breakthrough efforts last week from Highland's Anton Porter (49-9 1/2) and Helix's Tony Ortiz (49-3) were the best marks in the state this year under any condi-

tions. Rashod Higgs of Inde (San Jose) has gone 48-2 to head up a dozen athletes having gone 47 plus.

The leading entrants in discus hail from opposite ends of the Southern Section, Esperanza's Travis Pendleton (state-leading 199-2) and Arroyo Grande's Sean Shields (199-1) being the latest products of pair of factories. Few schools have generated as many top weight men over the years as these two recognized powerhouses. Rhuben Williams of Eagle Rock has been at the top of the for shot put supremacy for years with a heave of 61-8 1/2. Atwater's Rusty Price (61-8) and Arroyo Grande's Shields (60-0) are the other 60-footers in the field.









**John Larralde**  
Carpinteria H.S.



Fitzhugh has been involved in track and field for most of her life. She began her career in Eureka, competing in the Junior Olympic Program. She was a three-sport athlete in college and was all-conference in volleyball, basketball and track at Cal State University Chico. Fitzhugh began her coaching career at Hamilton City High School. She took over the girls' program at Oroville High in 1989 and joined Central Valley in 1998.

**Charles Leathers**  
JW North H.S.

In his 25 year career, Leathers has coached eight state champions, 26 all-Americans, three national record-holders and a female Gatorade Athlete of the Year. Perhaps the highlight of his career came last year when the North High girls' team beat Long Beach Wilson, 42-37, to win the CIF State Championship. His teams have also garnered eight CIF Southern Section titles (1980, 1985, 1991, 1995-98 and 2000).

**Tom Martin**  
Rancho Bernardo H.S.

Martin has been an assistant track and field coach Rancho Bernardo High School since 1991 (hi jumps and pole vault). He has also made coach stops at Monte Vista High in San Diego (1983-85) a Poway High (1986-91). Martin, who was Grossmont League Coach of the Year 1985, has guided back-to-back pole vault state champions in Tracy O'Hara and Kathleen Donoghue (state meet record-holder).

## Former State Winners to Be Honored; Will Assist With Awards

The CIF will honor a select group of former state champions at a special awards presentation at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, June 3. The honorees will also assist in the awards presentations, in the event in which they participated.

**Al Hassen (Jefferson High, L.A. - 1930)**  
Hassen is believed to be oldest living champion. He won the 1930 880 title in a big upset. Finished second in his league and fourth in Southern Section meet.

**Lou Zamperini (Torrance High, SS - 1935)**  
Zamperini set a National Record that stood for 20 years as a junior in 1934. He won state as a junior. Zamperini won the 1936 Olympic Trials at 5000m, and was the leading American in that event at Berlin Olympic Games. He was a two-time NCAA Mile winner while at USC. His life has been chronicled in a book "Devil at my Heels" and a recent one-hour prime time special documenting his WWII tribulations (lost at sea, prisoner of war).

**Wilbur Miller (Jefferson High, LA - 1937)**  
Miller won state 440 in 1937. He set a Community College record of 47.1 for 440 in 1938 at Compton College. Miller was also a member of three consecutive National Record relay teams at Jefferson in 1935, 1937 and 1937.

**Wilbur Thompson (Modesto High, SJS - 1937)**  
Thompson, who weighed just 165 pounds, won three weight events at 1937 State Meet -- 12 lb shot, exhibition 16 lb shot and football throw (an official event then). He won two NCAA medals at USC and after service during WWII, returned home to win the Shot Put at the 1948 Olympics in London.

**Ollie Matson (Washington High, San Francisco - 1948)**  
Matson finished 3rd in both 100/200 dashes in

1948 state meet. A week after the state meet, he ran 47.1 for 440 yards, one half second faster than any high schooler had ever run. It took seven more years for any other California high school runner to break 48 seconds. He was a Bronze medalist at 400m at 1952 Helsinki Olympic Games while attending University of San Francisco and lead off US 4x400m Relay team that broke existing WR but finished second. Best known for college and professional football career and is a member of the NFL Hall of Fame.

**Guy Blackburn (Jefferson High, LA - 1950)**  
A member of the team that is considered the best overall high school team of all time. Blackburn won 1950 State 220 and was also a member of a Jefferson National Record relay team. His 9.6 in the 100 yard dash has been bettered by only 4 other sprinters in high school history. NCAA medalist while attending the University of California at Berkeley.

**Lang Stanley (Jefferson High, LA - 1950)**  
Stanley was 5th in mile in 1949 as a junior. Switched to 880 in the latter half of the 1950 season, where he broke every record possible, including Los Angeles City Section, State and National Records. Broke National record at 1950 State meet at Sacramento. He was first high schooler to break 1:54.0 in 880. Was world class half miler and NCAA champion while attending San Jose State.

**Steve Turner (Glendale High, SS - 1950)**  
Turner won both 120 yard high hurdles and 180 yard low hurdles at 1950 State Meet.






