


## WESTINGHOUSE RETURNS TO TOP TEAM POSITION

The strategy which worked in 1988 for Westinghouse was executed on Saturday, June 2, 1990 at Gallaudet University in Washington, D.C. Team Westinghouse ran away with the title at the **7th Annual Mid-Atlantic Corporate Relays**. The cooperation extended by Gallaudet University has been the setting for four (4) years of intense competition and fun by the teams participating. The event was sponsored by the Mid-Atlantic Corporate Athletic Associations, an affiliate of the United States Corporate Athletics Association (USCAA).

The variety of the fourteen (14) events places a responsibility on the team captain to meet the road races and track events. The females remain the dominant force behind the teams. The level of performance of a team equals the level of performance of each member. The runners range from the novice to the experienced track athlete. This year sixteen (16) teams participated.

The race day officiating was conducted by the Montgomery County Road Runners Club. The weather was typical for June, projected high humidity, temperature range of 65 to 83 degrees. The sports drink EXCEED was available to replace those fluids and assisted in maintaining the needed energy level.

The ladies started the morning with 5K over a three loop course. The lead position at the start was assumed by regular Laura Gaydos of General Electric. Gaydos had winning on the mind but hanging back in fourth position for half of the event was **Mary Gaylord** of American Management Systems. Gaylord made a move on the back portion of the course. Once in control, Gaylord maintained the lead to finish with 18:34 followed closely by Gaydos with 18:42. The third position was captured by Laura Cameron of Westinghouse with 18:45.

The course record at Gallaudet stands at 17:35 (1988, Lorraine Hochella of Tenneco). The first master was **Sharon Hamilton - Dolan** (8th overall) of IBM with 19:55 which is the new master's course record. The 5K had 47 finishers.

Within minutes after the finish of the 5K the men started their six (6) loop 10K event. The three (3) time winner and course record holder at Gallaudet (33:12) Chris Samley of General Electric returned to capture title number four. In 1985, Samley set a 32:11 at the course in Columbia, Maryland. Samley set out on a demanding pace which after the first loop opened about a 100-yard lead. The second loop was painting a nice picture for Samley but on the third loop a leatherneck (U.S. Marine) was within striking distance. As **Bill Halliday** of USMC Henderson Hall passed a fellow Marine called out, "You can catch him sir." Halliday, obeying orders by the fourth loop, had command and placed Samley 100 yards back; there was to be no reversal or come back. Halliday pressed hard to finish with a new course record for Gallaudet at 33:00. Samley finished a strong second with 33:16. Team mate Robert Goodman (General Electric) was third with 33:56.

The master record of 37:27 was set in 1988 (Bob Johnson of COMSAT) was lowered to 35:30 by **Allen Gamber** of USMC Henderson Hall (9th overall). The 10K had 98 finishers.

The setting changed to the track for the balance of the twelve (12) events which would require a mixture of male, female and coed teams. At the conclusion of each event the overall lead was constantly changing and positions being separated by one point.

There were other records which fell, the Women's 800 Meter Team race saw the Westinghouse team lower the 1988 time of 5:00 (General Electric) to 4:58.

The TENNECO team lowered their 1989 record of 3:53 to 3:52 for the Sub-Master's Sprint Relay (legs of 200 meters, 200, 400, and 800 meters). The time in the President's Relay (800 meters, 400, 1600 meters) was lowered from the 1988 time of 9:12 (American Management Systems) to 8:56 by the team from USMC Henderson Hall.

The field events were added this year as non-scoring, in 1991 they will count towards the team's overall score. The men's long jump saw C. Russel of General Electric jump 21.27 feet, while for the females Gill of Potomac Electric and Power Company made it 13.65 feet. The men's shot put saw Johns of General Electric make a distance of 47.3 feet while Jennifer Walz of General Electric made it 31.3 feet.

A note of special thanks to athletic assistant Dave Ellam of Gallaudet University and medical coverage by Lee Stone (member of the Northern Virginia Sports Medicine Association). Random awards were donated by Runner's World and Sportwide. The Greenbelt Marriott provided the accommodations for the out-of-town runners. Thanks to all who participated.
