Mid-ATLANTIC CORPORATE ATHLETICS ASSOCIATION WASHINGTON, DC

The Mid-Atlantic Corporate Athletics Association is an affiliate of the United States Corporate Athletics Association. The USCAA is the governing body for the now twelve (12) regional meets in addition to the National Track Championship which is an event for the National Title. Also, there is a National Marathon which is held once a year. The event for the regional meet is derived from the national structure.

The event is open to government agencies, military and corporations. The purpose of the meet is to promote health and fitness among the employees. The participants of the meet vary from those who have been athletically competitive since childhood, to those who recently started running for health and fitness reasons. The atmosphere is friendly, yet competitive for those from the corporate officers through rank and file employees.

The overall relays do not have a sponsor, therefore, the cost of the relays

is passed along to each runner. The majority of the teams do not receive company funding. In recognition of the performance in the events, award medals are given to the top three teams in each of the events. In addition, there are particular medals for all runners, and each runner receives a T-shirt.

Because limited available finances prevented widespread advertising in local and national running publications, the following information is to provide some history behind the relays. We are always seeking new ideas to improve and grow the relays.

Much of the strength and popularity can be directly attributed to the team captain. We are projecting a steady increase in runners over the years.

The bottom line is dedication to fitness, the spirit of teamwork and cooperation.

Mid-ATLANTIC CORPORATE ATHLETICS ASSOCIATION HISTORY

On Saturday, May 2, 1983, seven companies met at the Byrd Stadium located on the Campus of the first Washington, DC area Corporate Cup Relays. The Meet Director was Dan Rincon. The event was funded by Runner's World and was started on the West Coast in 1978 by Bob Anderson. The events are designed to promote physical fitness through running and to provide an atmosphere of friendly competition. The event was open to companies, government agencies and military teams.

The teams which participated in the first year were American Management System, American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy, IBM Bell Systems, Westinghouse, General Electric and Honeywell.

In 1984, the Corporate Cup Relays, which was to be held in Washington, DC, was cancelled for financial reasons. The event did not prove to be profitable, and the participation was low. On a local note, there was not mcuh press given in 1983, except for an article which appeared in the Washington Post and was featured in the Business Section.

On Saturday, June 30, 1984, the First Annual Mid-Atlantic Corporate Relays were held in Oakland Mills High School in Columbia, Maryland. The Meet Director was Joe Herget. It was a request from Bill Conroy to Nelda (Casper) Clelland and myself that initiated our making phone calls to obtain participation from other teams. There were a total of ten (10) teams, of which six (6) were not participants in 1983.

On Saturday, June 15, 1985, the Second Annual Mid-Atlantic Corporate Relays was held in Oakland Mills High School in Columbia, Maryland. The Meet Director was Joe Herget. An event that was predicted to have low participation saw the total teams increase to nineteen (19) with thirteen (13) new teams. The popularity of the event was increasing along with the total numbers of runners. Also, the performance standards of the runners were improving. Not only did the teams concentrate on getting the maximum number of runners on the track, but they concentrated on getting the best qualified runners. excitement of the event was holding from prior years.

On Saturday, June 7, 1986, the Third Annual Mid-Atlantic Corporate Relays were held at Galluadet College in Washington, DC with Joe Herget as the Meet Director. The move to Galluadet College was strategic, in that it was in a central and well-known location of Washington, DC and added a touch of class.

Galluadet University is a multi-purpose education and resource center which serves hearing impaired people around the world through its academic, research and public service programs.

The total team participation was eighteen (18) for 1986 with half of the teams returning from 1985. A major step was the local TV coverage provided by WTTG, Channel 5, which televised the highlights on on the evening news.

On Saturday, June 13, 1987, the Fourth Annual Mid-Atlantic Corporate Relays were held at Galluadet University in Washington, DC. The relays were

officiated by the Montgomery County Road Runners Club.

The total team participation was up to twenty-one (21) companies which represented thirty (30) teams. This year, there were prize and product donations from AVIA Athletic Shoe Company, The Running Journal and Gatorade. In addition, press coverage was provided by Tom Carter of the Washington Times Newspaper.

The total number of runners broke the 500 mark which was a distance from the 200 in 1984. This is significant since the major advertising has been word-of-mouth among the running community.

This year also marked the beginning of presenting T-shirts to all of the runners.

On Saturday, June 11, 1988, the Fifth Annual Mid-Atlantic Corporate Relays were held at Galluadet University in Washington, DC. The relays were officiated by the Montgomery County Road Runners Club.

The total team count was 22 companies and this included five (5) new teams. The total number of runners was 550. There was an increase in product and/or prize donations by AVIA Athletic Shoe Company, Superior Beverage Distributors (Bud Light), T. J. Sportwide, Runner's World and The Greenbelt Hilton Hotel.

The relays consisted of fourteen (14) events and 1988 saw six new teams records set. In the Men's Mile race, there were 38 runners and 12 were under 5 minutes with the fast time of 4:21.

The Women's 5K had two runners (Lorraine Hochella, TENNECO and

Mary Salmone, IBM) who were Olympic Marathon Trial Qualifiers.

The largest event was the Sprint Relay (required 6 runners, at least 2 females and 1 master) which held 138 runners. The legs were as follows: 200 meters; and 200, 200 meters. This event was domminated by TENNECO in a time of 3:32. The record for this event was set by TENNECO in 1986 with a time of 3:28.

On Saturday, June 3, 1989, the Sixth Annual Mid-Atlantic Corporate Relays were held at Galluadet University. There were 16 teams participating, accounting for 500 runners and 3 new teams. The two primary events, which had 19 relay teams entered, was the 3 Lap Sprint and the Sprint Relay.

The Women's 5K was won by Lorraine Hochella of TENNECO and the course record holder (17:35) clocked an 18:30. The Master was Noel Relyea of Dupont with 21:17. Christopher Samley of General Electric dominated the 10K with 33:30. The first Master was Richard Stotlar of AT&T with 36:04.

There were three new records set, Dupont lowered their 1988 mark for the Executive Relay from 19:30 to 18:55. TENNECO lowered a 1988 mark of 3:54 set by General Electric in the Sub Masters Sprint Relay. Westinghouse lowered a 1984 mark of 5:40 set by General Electric for the Master's Relay. Dupont was the overall leader in First Place.

The event was officiated by Montgomery County Road Runners Club. Support for the event was received from AVIA Shoe Company, Superior Beverages, EXCEED, Greenbelt Marriott, Sportwide, Inc. and the numerous runners.

On Saturday, June 2, 1990, the Seventh Annual Mid-Atlantic Corporate Relays were held at Galluadet University. There were 16 teams represented which accounted for close to 500 runners. Each year, one to two new teams join the ranks to replace those departing. The loss of team captains has caused the departure of teams. The event continues to be supported by the entry fee and no sponsor. The University has been the site of this event for four (4) years.

The race conditions were usual for June, 65 to 83 degrees. The availability of the sports drink EXCEED made a difference in keeping energy levels up. The Montgomery County Road Runners Club returned to their officiating positions.

The new addition was the long jump and shot put. C. Russell of General Electric jumped 21.27 feet to take first place. Tricia Gill of PEPCO set the standard for the women with 13.65 feet. The men's shot put was captured by Johns of General Electric with 47.3 feet while

Jennifer Walz of General Electric made it 31.3 feet. These events will be scored next year.

Mary Gaylord of AMS took the women's 5K with 18:34. A new master's record was set by Sharon Hamilton-Dolan of IBM with 19:55. The men's 10K was captured by Bill Halliday of the U.S. Marines with 33:00, which was a record for Galluadet. Allen Gamber of the U.S. Marines set a new master's record of 35:30.

The competition increases from year-to-year. Team Westinghouse lowered the 1988 mark in the Women's 800 meter from 5:00 (GE) to 4:58. Team TENNECO lowered their 1989 record of 3:53 to 3:52 for the Sub-Master's Sprint Relay. The U.S. Marines lowered the time set by AMS of 9:12 (1988) for the President's Relay to 8:56.

Special thanks to the Greenbelt Marriott, Sportwide, Runner's World, Tom Wick's Sports Lettering and the other contributors who made 1990 a success.



WESTINGHOUSE HOLDS OFF A TENNECO ASSAULT AT THE CORPORATE RELAYS

The year started off with a question mark about the 8th ANNUAL MID-ATLANTIC CORPORATE RELAYS, there was no location. In April, Montgomery College in Rockville, Maryland was available for the June 8, 1991 meet. The wheels started to turn on short notice and fourteen (14) companies accounted for nineteen (19) teams.

The weather was mild with low 70s and sunny skies and a cool breeze throughout the day. This year the teams received points from the long jump, high jump and the shot put in addition to the other events. The road race was replaced by a 5K on the track for the women and the men, each ran a couple of heats. It was different but no one went of course.

The overall objective was to promote physical fitness through running. In addition, a spirit of competition for those athletes who were trying to place on their National teams that would be participating in the USCAA National Track and Field Championship in July in Santa Barbara, CA.

To fuel the runners, PowerBars were available to get them started. To keep the fluids up EXCEED was at the site. Runner's World provided prizes through their support program. Sportwide assisted the runners with their clothing needs. The Bethesda Marriott served as the host hotel.

The day started off with the women's 5K as Mary Gaylord of American Management System (AMS) was attempting for a second year win (1990 18:34). There were other plans being made. The lead was taken by Mary McCullough (AMS) and Janet Healy (General Electric) with Gaylord a few paces back. In the closing laps Healy proved to be the stronger with an 18:04 win. McCullough captured second with 18:20 and Gaylord was third with 19:10. The first master was Sharon Hamilton-Dolan (IBM) with 19:41 (fifth overall). A new meet record was established by Healy and Dolan. The overall scoring required three finishers who were scored within their age groups (eight divisions). The winning team was IBM (Sharon Hamilton-Dolan, Marjorie Marque and Geraldine McKethan).

The track was still hot as the men pulled up. The event had Farley Simon (USMC Henderson Hall), the runner up in the 1989 USMC Marathon and Chris Samley (General Electric) who captured a few of the 10K titles in the relays. The lead was taken by Samley and Stephen Egolf (Westinghouse) with Simon holding a few paces back. As the laps began to diminish Simon made his way to the pole position and established a pace that put some distance between Egolf and Samley. Simon crossed with 15:09 with Egolf in second with 15:41. The third position was captured by Gregory Kaplan (USMC) with 15:45 and Samley was fourth with 15:48. The first master was David King (General Electric) with 16:42 (9th overall). The team title was captured by the Marines (Simon, Kaplan Ben Lane, Alberto Martinez and Greg Langer).

A hot contest was in the Men's Mile team race as each team placed their best milers on the track. At the start, three runners broke free, Bill Ledder (Logistics Management Institute), Jim Clelland (Westinghouse) and Farley Simon (USMC Henders Hall). Ledder had the pole position for a short duration as Simon edged to the front and began a pace that could not be matched. At the bell Simon locked in to finish strong with a 4:19.80 and Ledder with 4:20.63 and Clelland was third with 4:21.35. The prior meet record was 4:24. The several heats had a total of thirty (30) participants of which seventeen had times under five minutes. The team title went to the Marines with a combined time of 8:56 (the other Marine was W. Gar with 4:35.92). The meet team record (8:43) was set in 1986 by Westinghouse.

A new meet record was established in the Master's Relay (800, 400, 800 meters) by Westinghouse with a time of 5:30. The prior record was set by Westinghouse in 1989 (5:33).

The President's Relay (800,400, 1600 meters) where each participant had to be a vice-president (military rank of 0-5 and above) or above, had the title go to the Marines with a time of 9:51.

In the shot put, the team title was awarded to TENNECO. The scoring was based on the summed score of the two best athletes on a age and sex adjusted scale. Don Steepe (32') and Robert Scott (47') were the leaders. The team jump was determined by the summed score of the two best athletes who had to long jump and high jump. TENNECO leaped to another victory as Chris Vest did 18'2" in the long jump and 6'4" in the high jump. James Turnstall did a 22'5" in the long jump and 6'6" in the high jump.

Throughout the day Westinghouse was being chased by every team with TENNECO in close striking distance. Each time Westinghouse was able to get away by a few seconds. Westinghouse added win number three out of 8 meets (winners in 1988 and 1990) with 664 points to TENNECOs 652 points (winners in 1986 and 1987). The third place team was USMC Henderson Hall with 631 points.

The competition remained healthy in all of the events at the front and the rear. The strategy was to enter all of the events in order to collect points. There were many satisfied athletes at the close of the day as they demonstrated the ability to start an event and to finish to add to the total team effort.

A special note of thanks to the Montgomery County Road Runners Club for the outstanding officiating that was performed and they kept the meet on track.
