# Lincoln Wins Cross-Country

Coach Lee Cox' Lincoln Lions yesterday captured the Peninsula Athletic League Cross Country championship over a water-logged Stanford University golf course. Jack Jones, 1952 PAL mile champion from Sequoia, won the event over a 1.75 mile course in 8 min., 53 sec.

Charles Ashby, Lincoln, paced the local runners with his third-place finish. Lion Don Bowden was fourth; Frank Wulftange of Lincoln, sixth; Walt Swarthout and Rich Carrillo, both of Willow Glen were seventh and eighth respectively, and Lincoln's Marvin Gross was ninth.

Other Lincoln boys who finished were Jack Havey, 19th; Tony Starbird, 28th, and Mel Sommer, 30th. Willow Glen runners included Lew Scamperrino, 36th; Duane Hagemeyer, 37th, and Tony Torres, 38th.

Forty-nine of the 55 starters finished the race.

In the team race behind Lincoln's 41 were Palo Alto, 66; Capuchino, 73; Sequoia, 91; Willow Glen and San Mateo, 126, and Carmont, 161.
