

Bay Schools In Harrier Meet

Cross country teams from San Ramon High School of Danville and Richmond yesterday won the right to race in the North Coast cross country championship meet at the Stanford Golf Course in Palo Alto next Saturday morning.

The two prep schools were named to the five-school meet by winning their group races in yesterday's North Coast semi-final meet at Palo Alto.

San Ramon, running in the Group I class for schools with enrollment under 700 students, took first place by scoring 33 points. Piedmont was second with 55 points and Bishop O'Dowd of Oakland third with 61 points.

Richmond captured the group V race for schools with enrollment over 1,650. Hayward High was second.

The other three winners were Tamalpais, Group II; Palo Alto, Group III, and Carlmont of Belmont, Group IV.

You will miss a good bet if you do not recognize the terrific local angle involved in the North Coast Section Cross Country Championships to be held on the Stanford Golf Course, Saturday, 10:00AM. As you reported last week, 26 schools met in the NCS X-Country Group Championships. The outcome of last Friday's meet finds 7 teams going into the finals this Saturday morning. The five Group Champions are; San Ramon, winner of the small school class, Tamalpais, winner of the 700 to 1000 class, Paly, the shut-out victor of the 1000 to 1200 class, Carlmont, easy victor of the 1200 to 1650 class, and Richmond, the colossus of Northern California high schools with an enrollment of 3577 students, winner of the large school class. ~~Two other teams have qualified because they were~~ Hayward High School and Alcatraz High School of Lafayette both qualified because they had the two best second-place teams on the basis of time.

One would think that the two top contending teams would be represented by some of the sections larger schools, but actually the two teams that promise to kick up the most heels this Saturday morning will not be "large" schools at all. Even more strange, these two schools are practically neighbors and this will be their third hotly contested meeting of the year. Carlmont High with 1205 students and Palo Alto with 1192 students are considered to be way and above the rest of the high school cross country teams of Northern California, if not of the entire state. Paly and Carlmont met the first time at full force on October 28th and the result was a tie-28 to 28. The next meeting was the crucial PAL Championship Meet where 10 PAL schools met to see Paly and Carlmont make almost a dual meet out of the championships with their taking ten out of the first eleven places. Carlmont dethroned the Vikings with the 29 to 35 score, Jefferson, the third team placed way back with 105 points and San Jose High the last place team scored 222 pts to further accent the school domination of this sport. With the two schools taking a vacation from each others company in the Group Championships, each easily won its group race with ridiculous ease.
