Palo Alto high school's crosscountry team finally has proved itself to be the nation's leader. The Vikings have won the second annual national twomile team race competition, open to all high schools in the

mile team race competition, open to all high schools in the country, and won it with a new record time. Results of the postal competition were announced today by Track & Field News, sponsor of the event.

RUNNING AT Stanford Dec.

RUNNING AT Stanford Dec. 6, the Paly aces put five men across the two-mile finish line in a total time of 50:17.7. This was more than 40 seconds faster than the second place team and nearly eight seconds under the

nearly eight seconds under the old national mark.

Two other Midpeninsula teams finished in the first ten nationally. Carlmont was fourth, with 51:41.2, and Los Altos finished ninth with 52:19.9.

George Linn, Viking senior, was the individual leader with a promising 9:33.0, third fastest two-mile ever run by a prep. Teammates Mike Chilton and Mike Lehner finished second and third nationally with times of 9:49.7 and 9:50.0. Carlmont's Jim Reams was fifth at 9:58.3

Jim Reams was fifth at 9:58.3 and Dixon Farmer of Miramonte 10th with 10:05.0.

Reams (9:49.9) and Dave Boore of Los Altos (9:59.0) had better times than credited with in the final standings, but the times were not made in the races in which their teams did best. Bill Yaley of Serra High ran 9:40.5 but Serra did not

have a full team.

CALIFORNIA dominated the competition, placing seven teams in the first 10: 1—Palo Alto, 50:17.7; 2, Culver City, 51:00.8; 3, Mira Costa of Manhattan Beach, 51:32.8; 4, Carlmont, 51:41.2; 5, Fresno, 51:46.7; 6, Aviation of Redondo Beach, 51:58.0; 7, East of Wichita, Kansas, 52:05.5; 8, Mt. Lebanon, Pittsburgh, Pa., 52:05.8; 9, Los Altos, 52:19.9; 10, Beaumont of St. Louis, Mo., 53:02.1.

Palo Alto High School's cross-country team, best in Northern California, will run in a special postal match against East High School of Wichita, Kan., tomorrow.

The Vikings will run a fiveman team at Stanford Stadium. Each of the runners will go eight laps on the quarter-mile track. At the same time Wichita runners will be running on a quarter-

mile track in Kansas.

The times will be compared by mail to determine the winner. The race will bring together there world-record holders. Running for East High School is Archie Sanra-mani Jr. As a junior he ran a mile in 4:17.2 for the best time ever recorded by a junior.

Palo Alto has the other two record holders. Mike Chilton, a junior, ran a mile in 4:26.1 as a 15-year-old for the best-

#### Palo Alto Sets Record

Palo Alto, Calif., is the winner of the second annual Track & Field News nal two-mile team race postal competition. Second last year, Palo Alto the 1958 match with a new record time of 50:17.7, an average of 10:03.5 for each of the five men.

Individual winner was George Linn, Palo Alto senior, with a new mark of 9:33.0. He displaced former teammate John Northway, the 1957 winner at 9:47.0. Former team record holder at 50:25.5 was Morningside of Inglewood, Calif. Morningside did not compete this year, but Diz Miller, the 1957 Morningside coach, moved to Mira Costa High, Manhattan, Calif., and came up with a third place team.

Six teams broke 52 minutes in 1958 as compared with only two in 1957. The tenth place team last year was 16 seconds faster than the year before. Individually, six runners were under 10 minutes, as against only three in 1957. Several other good times were recorded but were not eligible either because the athlete was not part of a full team, or because the team had a better time in another competition. Teams were eligible to try as many times as they wanted but individual marks counted only when made during the team's best efforts.

For the 1959 competition, which will range from Sept. 1 to Dec. 15, individual honors will go to the fastest runners without the above limitations. It also is planned to expand the competition to include Canadian high schools.
