Hamblen Sets Record at Mt. Sac

Dave Hamblen and Tom Davidson blistered the Mt. Sac course record Friday as they led the Aztecs to a slim 35-39 victory over Cal Poly Pomona. San Jose State was third with 50 points.

Hamblen's course shattering pace of 20:52 for the four mile course was over 20 seconds better than Andy Harrity's old record of 21:15. Harrity ran for the University of Southern California. Davidson's time was a record breaking 20:56.

"Cal Poly was much tougher than we anticipated," said Aztec coach Tony Sucec. "Cal Poly knows the course because it is in their backyard. They did a good job and hung in real well. They actually passed some of our men at the finish."

San Jose State made a much

stronger showing Friday than two weeks ago at Sacramento. Byron Lowrey, Darold Dent and Sid Vollmer were all in the top 10.

"San Jose's top three men ran real well," Sucec said. "They ran like we know they can."

Top finishers for the Aztecs were Pete Virgadamo, eighth, Tim Danielson, 10th, Lynn Bueh-

ler, 12th, Roger Friend, 13th, Chuck Windsor, 15th, Skip Crowley, 19th, and Bob Messina, 24th.

"Danielson and Messina ran real gutty races for us," Sucec said. They were both running with blisters and aggravated them during the race. I really admire them for even finishing the race.
