Harriers nose out Bruins

With a record-setting performance by Ole Oleson as the keynote, USC's cross country team emerged victorious over UCLA, 27-28, after their six-mile battle at Elysian Park last weekend.

On a beautiful Saturday morning, USC took the early lead with both teams running in groups. But at the mid-way point, after a long downhill stretch, UCLA was in control. Although Oleson was leading, the rest of the USC group had broken up and, with the exception of Jeff Marsee, had fallen back.

Marsee, however, was not in any lack of company, running right in the middle of four Bruins. At this point, with a long climb uphill facing them, the Bruins were leading 26-29.

At the top of the hill with close to a mile remaining, the Bruin bloc was beginning to dissipate. Oleson had a secure grip on first and Ruben Chappins was in control of second for UCLA, but after them it was up for grabs.

Marsee was holding off UCLA's Ron Johnson and Neil Sybert and Joe Balasco was trying to stay ahead of USC's Rick Carr. Although their hold was shaky, the Bruins were still in the

lead, 27-28.

But the only place the score counts is at the finish, and that is where the Trojans cashed in. Oleson won, finishing in course record time of 27:20 (Oleson set the old record of 27:56 a week earlier at the Cal meet). Chappins finished second for UCLA in 27:44, also breaking the old record. Marsee finished third, beating Johnson by two seconds and Sybert by eight.

But it was Carr, running his best race in a long time to beat out the fourth Bruin, Balasco, that tipped the scoring balance in favor of Troy. After Balasco came Curtis Jones and Andy Herrity to cinch the meet. The sixth Trojan was Jim Bernick, who finished eleventh. All the USC runners improved their times from the week before by at least 20 seconds, with Bernick running 56 seconds faster, the most improved.
