ARTICLE XVI

CROSS COUNTRY BY-LAWS

OFFICIAL RULES

The official rules for cross country are contained in the current edition of the National Alliance Track and Field Rule Book, in the CIF By-laws, and in these league by-law

CLASSIFICATIONS

The three official cross country teams are the varsity, sophomore, and freshman teams.

GENERAL RULES FOR ALL CLASSIFICATIONS

- 1. Practice limitations outlined in Article VIII of the league by-laws shall be in effect.
- 2. Cross country participants must have a minimum of five (5) days practice before competing in a meet.
- 3. School teams shall not participate in a meet prior to the date set by the Board of Managers.
- 4. All team members within a given race will wear the same type of uniform.
- 5. In all meets involving only the SCVAL, spikes may not be worn.

LEAGUE FINALS

- 1. The league finals shall determine the league standings and the league champion in varsity, sophomore, and freshman cross country.
 - 1.1 A boy may compete in just one (1) classification in the league finals.
- 2. The number of participants from each school shall be limited as follows:
 - 2.1 Varsity A limit of seven (7) entrants.
 - 2.2 Sophomore and Freshman A limit of ten (10) entrants.
- 3. An open race shall be run at the league finals.
 - 3.1 Any boy who has not participated in the official varsity, sophomore, or freshman races may enter.
- 4. Medals shall be awarded to the boys who finish the first ten (10) places in each official race (varsity, sophomore, and freshman.)
- 5. The top seven (7) times of either sophomore or freshman teams will qualify that school for the Region meet.

SCHEDULE

- 1. Schools may compete in one (1) meet per school week.
- 2. Schools may compete in a total of thirteen (13) meets per season (not including league, Region, and Section meets.)
- 3. In years when the C.C.S. meet is held in Region I, III, or IV, each school may compete in one (1) center meet at the site of the Section meet.

Cross Country By-Laws

Revised June 26, 1970

- 1. Region Meets will be held in the week preceding Thanksgiving week.
 - 1.1 Region Meets shall be held in each Region each year for the purpose of qualifying boys to the Section Meet.
 - 1.2 Regions will be made up of the following leagues:
 - Region I North Peninsula, Mid-Peninsula, West Catholic
 - Region II Santa Clara Valley, South Peninsula
 - Region III Santa Teresa, Mt. Hamilton, West Valley
 - Region IV Monterey Bay, Mission Trail, Coast Athletic Association
- 2 Section Meet will be held annually on the Wednesday before Thanksgiving.
 - 2.1 The Section Meet will rotate among the Regions as follows:
 - . 1970 Region I 1971 Region III 1972 Region IV 1973 Region II
- 3. Region Committee shall consist of of the Cross Country Chairman of each League, the Region Meet Director and the League Commissionersof the Region.
- 4. Sites Each Region will establish a site for the Region Meet.
 - 4.1 The sites locted will be on a course set for a distance of 1.8 to 3 miles.
 - 4.2 This site will also be used for the Section Meet when the Region is scheduled to hold the Section Meet.
 - 4.3 TheRegion Committee shall have authority to select the site in the Region.
 - 4.4 The Region hosting the Section Meet will host at least three Center Meets on the same site.
- 5. <u>Divisions-There</u> shall be a Small-School; large-School split at the Region and Section levels. Specifications for the split follow:
 - 5.1 Three year school will have enrollments adjusted by a factor of 1.39.
 - 5.2 All-boy schools shall have enrollments adjusted by a factor of 2.00.
 - 5.3 The small school-large school division point shall be determined by listing adjusted enrollments in increasing order and dividing so the first (small) 40% of the schools are "small" schools. For 1970 "smallsmools to be 1527 or lease.
 - 5.4 The previous year's enrollment data shall be used to establish the division point required in item (5.3) above.
 - 5.5 "Large schools" with an enrollment drop sufficient to place them in the "small school" division shall be able to compete in the "small school" division during the current year rather than waiting until the following year.
 - 5.6 Unusually strong "small schools" may compete in the "large school" division if they so desire.
 - 5.7 Associate member schools shall qualify to CCS through the Region in which they are geographically located.
 - 5.8 Adjusted enrollments and number of schools in each Region when small schoollarge school division is 40-60.

6. Order of Races-The order of events for Regional and Sectional Meets shall be:

1 Small School Frosh-Soph
2 Large School Frosh-Soph
3 Small School Varsity
4 Large School Varsity

7. Awards

Region-First and second place team plaques shall be awarded in both Divisions Ribbons shall be awarded the first ten runners in the Small-School Division for both Vargity and Frosh-Soph Competitors.

Section-Small Schools Division, 1st, 2nd and 3rd place trophies-Varsity only Large Schools Division, 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place trophies-Varsity only

Medals-1st ten Varsity runners in Small Schools Division 1st fifteen varsity runners in Large Schools Division

Ribbons-1st ten runners in Smell Schools Frosh-Soph event 1st fifteen runners in Large Schools Frosh-Soph Event

8. ADDITIONAL EVENTS-Frosh and Junior Varsity races will be run without awards following the OFFICIAL races, with the number of entrants the same as for the large schools division.
