Defending Northern California JC cross country champion Fresno CC has established itself as the team to beat in the north again. Following up the previous week's runner-up performance to El Camino at Half Moon Bay, the Rams convincingly won the Golden Gate four mile team race at San Francisco's Golden Gate Park (Sept. 25). Greg Hall took individual honors for Fresno.

The combination of times of the first five Ram runners gave Fresno a 1:46:53 team time to 1:48:16 for defending Golden Gate Conference champion San Mateo.
