Fullerton JC defeated College of the Sequoias, 7-5, for the championship of the 16-team Northern California Aquatic Federation water polo tourmament (small college division) Friday and Saturday (Oct. 1-2)

Meanwhile defending state champion Long Beach CC and NorCal champ De Anza were victims of NCAA powers in the nine-team open division. That division was won by San Jose State with a 7-4 victory over NCAA champion UC Irvine.

The tourney, biggest in the country, was played at three community college pools in Santa Clara County--West Valley, De Anza, and Foothill.

Long Beach opened with an 8-3 win over UC Davis while De Anza topped Fullerton State, 8-6. But then San Jose State eliminated Long Beach, 10-2, and Stanford beat De Anza, 11-3. (Stanford finished third.)

The l6-team small college division was divided into four sections, featuring round robin play in each opening day. Fullerton JC, Sequoias, Chico State, and University of the Pacific were the survivors and finished in that order in Saturday's finals. (Fullerton beat UOP, 6-1, and COS downed Chico, 7-6, in the semis.)
