# Distance runner Paul Mello from Azores to San Mateo

Paul Mello, a native of Derseda, an island in the Azores off the coast of Portugal, will be CSM's top distance runner this season.

Last year at the Northern California Championships he captured the 10,000 meter run and was constantly near the top, despite the fact he was plagued by a sore arch.

His coach says that he's a "hard worker, a demonstrative leader and a coach's delight."

But what makes this young man run? Where does he get his motivation? Basically it's pride. The only member from a family of seven to attend college, he constantly tries to improve his abilities as an athlete and, more important, as a person. "I have a chance to make good here in the States, a chance that many people take for granted. There's an opportunity for education here unlike Derseda and I'm just happy to have it," he says.

In Derseda, farming was the main way of life and the transition from

working on the land to studying hard at school has not been easy. However, through "real concentration" Paul is finding college a very "happy experience."

Running is his love and he claims that the physical discipline he puts his body through is good for his mental outlook "Running releases a lot of the everyday tensions. It's very satisfying to go all out for five or six miles and feel good about it."

It appears that Paul Mello is on his way toward a meaningful life. "I feel confident that I can really do well."

# Harriers ready for defense of conference championship

The defending Coden Cate Conference co-champion cross country team will be a strong favorite to keep the trophy at CSM this year, according to coach Bob Rush.

Despite the loss of last year's top three runners, Mitch Kingery, Dave Hull and Bob Barnett, CSM will still have a fast team led by Paul Mello, the defending Northern California 10,000 meter champion. Mello also placed third in the 10,000 meter run at last spring's Bakersfield State Championship.

Paul Wiemer, fifth man for College of Marin last year, has transferred to CSM and will be contributing to the team.

Sophanicaes Rim Sherrin, Carriek Davis, Chris Petit and Peter Ild will also be running for the cross country squad for the first time this fall.

Coach Rush is also hoping for help from freshmen Joe Green, a 9:11 2miler from Aragon High, and Ken McBride, a 9:17 2-miler from Half Moon Bay High. Freshmen Lonnie Treu, Rich Boldocchi, Walter Haight and Jon Tscharner will also be trying hard to make the team.

Bob Rush expects the toughest competition to come from American River College, West Valley College, San Jose City College, Santa Rosa College, Delta College and Fresno College. "One of these seven (the six listed above plus CSM) has taken the championship for the past nine years," said Rush.

The first race of the season will be the Ninth Annual CSM Beach Run to be held at Half Moon Bay's El Granada Beach tomorrow at 9 a.m.

The first of the dual meets that help determine the championship will be run Oct to against Funthill College and Chahut Lidlege Livin days later, on Oct. 8, CSM will host most of the major junior colleges in the state at the CSM Invitational. Both races will be held at the Crystal Springs course.

# Harriers take fourth in meet in spite of Paul Mello's win

Despite a first place finish by CSM's Paul Mello, the cross country team ended up fourth at the Golden Gate Invitational last weekend.

Mello, barely showing the strain of covering four miles of Golden Gate Park in 21:10.6, crossed the finish line well over 100 yards ahead of his nearest competitor, Doug Aurit of West Valley College. "Paul ran a very outstanding race," said coach Bob Rush about Mello's performance.

West Valley took the team honors, since their top five runners finishing times totaled 1:50:23. San Jose was second with 1:50:25, Fresno third with 1:50:36. CSM had 1:50:43, and the rest of the teams in this Northern California race finished well behind them.

Since the race does not affect the Golden Gate Conference standings, the close loss left coach Rush unconcerned. Rush stated that the only significance of the race was that it showed that it will be "the same old gang" of traditional rivals fighting it out for the Golden Gate Conference tit'e again this year. Coach Rush also commented on the "interesting tightness" of the top four teams who were only separated by 20 seconds.

The big surprise of the day for the Bulldogs was Chris Petit, who finished 35th and was CSM's fifth man across the finish line. Petit, only a freshman, "has shown great improvement," according to Rush.

The other top finishers were Rick Baldacchi, who finished 15th with a 22:08 timing, Rich Pincombe was 20th with 22:19 and Ken McBride was 25th with 22:27.

Coach Rush felt that some of his men could not turn in their best performances because "we are right in the middle of the hardest part of our training program, and some of the men are suffering from 'training hangover.'"

The cross country team's next race is the CSM Crystal Springs Invitational, which begins tomorrow morning at 11 a.m. CSM will then travel to Coyote Park in San Jose to race De Anza, Cañada and Laney Colleges on Thursday, Oct. 13 at 3:30 p.m.

CSM's first-ever women's cross country team won its first race. That they were the only school to field a complete team helped considerably, but coach Pete Michon was happy that the program got started on the right foot."

Joe Green is coming off his best race of the year as he took 11th at the prestigious Mt. SAC relays, covering the four mile course in 20:37. Pincombe. Petit and McBride rounded out CSM's top five as the Bulldogs took fourth overall.

# 'Heartbreaker' CSM runners

NEWARK - "Even though we lost a heart-breaker, I think this shows those who think otherwise that cross country is a true team sport," said College of San Mateo coach Bob Rush yesterday.

"This" was the Bulldogs' heartbreaking experience in the fourth and final Golden Gate Conference meet. San Mateo beat San Jose but lost to West Valley by one point (that is, one place) in a classic meeting between three. previously unbeaten teams.

# Mello sets record but harriers fail to win GGC crown

In a meet that has lost some of the significance it had a few weeks ago, the Bulldogs will travel to Rocklin for the Golden Gate Conference finals to be held today at noon.

The meet will decide which team in the conference will receive the winner's plaque, in addition to awards for runners who attain allconference status.

Due to last week's narrow 28-27 loss to West Valley College in a meet that brought together the GGC's unbeaten squads, CSM will have to settle for second place in the dual meet standings.

In that four-mile contest held at Coyote Hills Park in Newark, the Bulldogs were considered to be favorites if they performed up to their potential. But due to cross country's reliance on the team aspect of running, the squad fell.

According to coach Bob Rush, "This is a team sport; anybody who doesn't think so doesn't know the sport. There are some that want to change cross country to becoming more individually-oriented, but I think they're all wet."

This team emphasis was particularly noticeable in the Newark defeat as the Bulldogs' top four runners did what they were expected to do to win the meet, but because West Valley's sixth and seventh men edged out CSM's fifth man, the Bulldogs lost.

According to coach Rush, the meet was a perfect example of why the sport of cross country is so team-oriented, in that if any one member of the team doesn't do his job, the rest of the squad's efforts could be for naught in the team totals.

Those who came through were sophomore Paul Mello, establishing a course record of 19:54; Rick Pincombe, continuing "his most consistent season ever" by finishing third with the time of 20:05; Joe Green finishing sixth and Rick Baldocchi coming through in tenth.

Mello wasn't sure he would win the race, though he's done it most of the season, feeling that West Valley's Doug Avrit or Bob Paulin might edge him out.

The meet was close in both the score and the time totals, as West Valley's top five runners totaled 1:42:18 and CSM was but a scant four seconds behind.

If there was a surprise in the meet it was the distant third that the San Jose City squad pulled in. Before the race, the Jaguars were expected to battle for the team title, but their runners were edged out from many of the top positions by the Bulldogs and Vikings, relegating them to a disappointing third.

As for Pincombe's third place finish, it was both gratifying and surprising. As he tells it, "When I passed the two-mile mark (with the same time he had run it in high school) I did the best I could, and the practice that I've done just came together."
