Top 10 Performers

Since 1977, the San Diego State women's cross country team has used beautiful Balboa Park in downtown San Diego.

The 5000 meter course can be broken into three parts. The first 1600 meters, beginning at 6th and Laurel, is comprised of grass, dirt, and pavement trails. It's relatively flat, except for a 40-meter uphill, located halfway from the start.


The second 1600 meters is made up of rolling terrain, beginning with a sharp downgrade known as "Powder Hill", and ends with a brutal 100-meter incline known as the "Concrete Switchback".

The final 1800 meters is completely flat and runs along a seemingly endless row of palm tree's along 6th Street. The course ends at Balboa Drive and Quince Street.

A good spectator course, viewers can get to all markers, start and finish, with a little mobility.

Season Outlook

In 1979 the San Diego State Women's Cross Country team was described as young and enthusias-In 1980 they can be described as young, enthusiastic, and experienced.

Head coach Fred LaPlante has seven runners returning from last year's squad, including All-Conference runner Lynn Kanuka estab-Kanuka. lished new meet and course records at the UC Riverside and Aztec Invitationals.

Other returning Aztecs include: #3 runner Debbie Chaddock, #4 Tracy Trisco, #6 Eliana Garcia, Kneeshaw ran the sixth fasand #9 Carol Crumley. "This is a very cohesive group", says LaPlante. "They like their sport, and they like each other."

This group combined to win the Riverside Invitational, place second in the Aztec Invitational, fourth in the UCLA and WCAA meets, and eighth in the WAIAW Region 8 Championships.

The Aztecs have one major lal contenders, UCLA. loss heading into 1980. Number two runner, Chris Gilbreth is returning home to Santa Monica. On the positive side, the Aztecs have some people coming over from the

track team.

Freshman Monica Joyce, and sophomore Jane Spencer will be joining the team this Joyce ran cross coufall. ntry while living in England in 1978. Last spring she set school lecords in the 800 and 1500 meters.

LaPlante enter's his third year as coach of the women's cross country team, after leading the 1978 squad to a fourth place finish in the WCAA, the best ever by a SDSU team.

Since coming to San Diego State, the 30-year-old LaPlante has been named WCAA Cross Country Coordinator, to the Region 8 Cross Country Committee, along with coaching women's cross country and track teams. This summer LaPlante coached the Women's National Track team in Holland.

LaPlante, a runner is his own right in the 1500 meters and cross country, took the SDSU coaching job after coaching men's track as an assistant at Columbia University (New York, N.Y.)

He was also the head track coach for men and women at Garden City East High School in Garden City, Mich., men's head cross country coach at Washenaw Community College in Ann Arbor, Mich., men's head track coach at Hoover Junior High School in Taylor, Mich. and graduate assistant track coach at Eastern Michigan.

The native of Toledo, Ohio, recieved his B.S. from Eastern Michigan in physi-

cal education and English in 1972 and obtained his master's from the same school in physical education.

In his running days, La-Plante was a NCAA College Division All-American in the 1500 meters and was a member of two NCAA-CD national championship teams.

FR. 22 LA MESA

Liz is a senior transfer student from Indiana University.

While this will be her first time against collegiate competition, she has run for the AAU TC in Indianapolis. She has run the 5000 and 10,000 meters along with competiting in the half-marathon. She is a geology major.

SEPT. 20 AT WESTWOOD (11:00 a.m.)

There are two hills on the course, and the final 80 meters are over asphalt. Kathy Mintie of UCLA set a course and meet record last year.

Riverside Invitational

SEPT. 27 AT RIVERSIDE (11:00 a.m.)

SDSU returns to defend their championship. The Riverside Invitational will be expanding to include all Southern California teams. The 5000M course runs over rolling dirt roads, past citrus groves, and follows along Gage Canal. Lynn Kanuka of SDSU holds the meet and course record.

Aztec Invitational

OCT. 4 AT BALBOA PARK (9:30 a.m.)

This will be the 38th Annual Aztec Invitational, but only the fourth one the women's cross country team has competed in. CSULB will be returning to defend their championship. CSU-Long Beach, the defending champs; and Arizona, winners in 1977-78, have been invited. A key match up will be between Joy Hansen of Arizona and Lynn Kanuka of SDSU. Hansen has run the eighth fastest time at Balboa Park. Kanuka is the course and meet record holder. UCLA, USC, Arizona State, and CSU-Fullerton are a few of the teams that have been invited.

The 3000 Meter Postal Invitational will be run between September 1 until October 26. Top teams from across the country will be sending results of their time trials. All time trials will be timed on a 3000 meter track. The times will be sent to SDSU and correlated. Individual times will be posted, and awards will be given to the top finishers. No team scores will be kept.

San Diego State was founded in 1897. The University has grown from a small teachers college of 91, to a university of 34, 000. In 1969 the Aztecs were granted Division 1 status by the NCAA.
