





A Brief History of the CIF/Reebok State Championships

The CIF offers state championships in six different sports; cross country, girls' volleyball, wrestling, basketball, track and field and golf.

Track and field, the longest running state championship, was run for the first time at Fresno High in 1915 and reached the 72nd year mark during the 1990 CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships. Except for the war years from 1941-45, the track and field championships have been held annually.

Early championships were conducted at high schools, YMCA's, universities and fair sites including: the Sacramento Fair in 1918, the San Bernardino Fair of 1919, the Bakersfield Fair in 1920 and the Stockton Fair in 1922. The 1990 CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships marked the third consecutive year that Cerritos College, Norwalk was the host site. 1974 featured the first year of girls' competition in the CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships with the setting at Memorial Stadium, Bakersfield.

Accomplished athletes in various sports dot the list of California High School competitiors in the track and field state championships. Names like Dwight Stones, an Olympic medalist in the high jump, Rafer Johnson, a Gold Medalist in the decathlon, and Sherri Howard, an Olympian in the 4 X 400 highlight the list.

Track and field stars from California High

schools have gone on to succeed in other sports as well. Bobby Bonds of Polytechnic High in Riverside, who later became a major league baseball star, and Lynn Swann from Serra High in San Mateo, whose success came in professional football, were both state champions in the long jump - a feat Swann accomplished on two occasions (1969-70)

After track and field, the CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships were established in 1916 and were held until 1928. The first state basketball championship was played between Whittier High and Berkeley High at Whittier High School on March 25, 1916. The final result: Whittier 31-20. In 1989, Glendora High standout Tracy Murray set a record for most points scored with a phenomenal 64 - more than Berkeley and Whittier combined in the first title tilt. Women's basketball joined the state championships in 1981 when the championships were renewed for both boys and girls.

In its short history, the Girls' CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships have experienced tremendous success with names like national record holder Cheryl Miller, and 1990 sensation Lisa Leslie playing starring roles. Point Lomas's four state championships (1984 Division II; 1985-87 Division I) have also highlighted girl's competition.

On the boys' side, Stockton High dominated early play winning four championships in the 1920's (1922-23, 1925, 1928).

Crenshaw High equalled that dominance in the modern championship, winning four titles in the 1980's (1983, 1985-86, 1989). Besides Murray, great names like Michael Manning and 1990 standouts Shon Tarver and Ed O'Bannon have participated in the state finals.

The CIF/Reebok Basketball Championships have come a long way since its beginning at Whittier High in 1916. The 1990 championships marked the first time that all five boys' and girls' Divisions (I, II, III, IV and V) were housed under the same roof - the Oakland Coliseum. Attendance for the two-day championship eclipsed the 20,000 mark.

The CIF/Reebok State Wrestling Championships were established in 1973 and conducted at Cal State Hayward. The University of Pacific's Spanos Center has been the host site since 1987. Clovis High dominated during the first years of the championships, winning three consecutive CIF/Reebok State Wrestling Championships from 1974-76. Its fourth title in 1990 moved Clovis ahead of rival Clovis West as the team with the most state championships. Clovis West has won three titles (1983-84, 1989) in the 1980's.

With the largest participation of any girls' sport, volleyball has increased its following by leaps and bounds since the first CIF/ Reebok State Volleyball Championships in 1978. Highland High, Bakersfield won the first championship, held at Highland High.

CIF/Reebok Championship History Cont.

In 1981, a Division II classification was added to the championships and a year later a Division III classification was included.

The growth of the sport is also evident in terms of revenue. For the first time, volley-ball became self-supporting in 1990 netting more than \$12,000.

Considered the finest volleyball team in the nation last season by several publications, Mira Costa High from Manhattan Beach, completed an unbeaten season by defeating Lynbrook at the 1990 CIF/Reebok Division I State Championships. Rim of the World has three titles in Division II, while

Francis Parker has won three titles in Division III. Cal State Fullerton has been the host site for the CIF/Reebok Volleyball Championships since 1986. Cal Poly Pomona will be the setting for the 1990 championship in December.

Traditionally, the last CIF/Reebok Regional Championship completed during the course of the school year, the State Golf Championships were established in 1976 for boys and 1977 for girls and ran until 1981. Since then, regional championships have been conducted. The 1990 CIF/Reebok Regional Golf Championships were held

at El Caballero Country Club in Tarzana for Southern California and Del Rio Country Club, Modesto for Northern California.

The CIF/Reebok Cross Country Championships were the newest edition to the state championship fold in 1987 and have been held annually at Woodward Park, Fresno. Bryan Dameworth and Deena Drossin, both of Agoura High, have won three and two individual state titles respectively. Kira Jorgensen of Rancho Buena Vista won two consecutive individual state championships (1987-88). Palos Verdes girls' have dominated the team championship with three consecutive titles (1987-89).

1990 CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Championship Preview

(in the following preview abbreviations fro Sections are as follows: Northern (No), Sac Joaquin (SJS), Central (C), North Coast (NCS), Central Coast (CCS), Southern (SS), Los Angeles City (LA), and San Diego (SD).

The CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Championship, now in its fourth year, is much like a young child of the same age, having gone through the early crawling and walking stages, now really ready to get up and run. As part of this growing up, the 1990 meet marks a change from three to four divisions, with the state's eight hundred schools divided equally into the classifications. The addition of another division has geographically spread around even more than before the opportunities for championships. Once again, they are coming from the far reached of the state, with schools from north near the Oregon border, south to San Diego and across the state from the Sierra Nevada Mountains in the East to the blue Pacific Ocean, racing over the fine course here at Woodward Park in quest of statewide honors. The state is once again blessed with its usual number of very outstanding individuals and teams, with these intersectional competition certain to leave the course scorched by the end of the day.

The first group on the course this morning will be Division IV schools, with some fine teams amonge these schools of 938 students or less in enrollment. The boys race will feature a geographically diverse group, led by Maranatha (Sierra Madre-SS), which raced to an excellent 82:47 team time (top five on team times added up) in taking the Southern Section Division IV Finals on the tough Mt. San Antonio College Course.

Anthony Fisher and Oscar Montes lead Coach Ken Cronquist's strongly peaking squad. Bret Harte (Altavill-SJS) came south to the Mt. SAC Invitational in late October, racing 84:23 behind 1989 state third placer Brian Singleton, and defeating Fillmore (SS), which later improved to 84:07 behind Jorge Barajas. Yreka totaled 27 points from its tough pack in taking the Northern Division IV Finals. Corcoran is a fine team out of the Central Section. Morro Bay (SS) and St. Anthony (Long Beach-SS), with the latter led by the duo of Geoff Janquart (8th Div. II State '89) and Andre Faubert (12th Div. II '89), had strong Section Finals efforts. Some top individuals, in addition to those mentioned above, are 1989 Division III 5th placer, J.J. Castner (Oak Park-SS), 1989 Division III 6th placer Jeff Arnold (York, Monterey-CCS), Pascual Morales (Washington Union, Easton-Cen), Ken Rhoads (Colfax, SJS), Reel Anderson (South Fork, Miranda-NCS), Richie Broulet (Drake, San Anselmo-NCS), Paul Manson (Branson, Ross-NCS), and Greg Gatlin (Weed-No).

In girls Division IV action, in each of the last two weekends at Southern Section Qualifying and Finals competition, Nordhoff (Ojai), led by Dascha Spellman (8th state '89 Div. II), has upset seasonlong divisional favorite Morro Bay. Nordhoff had an excellent 102:05 Section Finals team time at Mt. SAC, with Morro Bay, led by Jenny Lacovara (9th state Div. III '89), 102:10. In the early October Stanford Invitational it was Morro Bay, Piedmont (NCS), and Nordhoff in that order in Division IV, with the North Coast power handling Nordhoff easily at that competition. There are others from around the state to mix up our batch of competition here. Anderson (No) has rolled over all of its size up north, led by twins Amie and Angie Diulio, with Bear River (Grass Valley-SJS) having Section divisional winner sophomore Anikai Webb on top. McFarland was a big Central Section winner at this level, with Half Moon Bay the Central Coast Section's best. Fillmore (SS) has Maribella Aparicio (7th state '89 Div. II) and Nikki Shaw, one of the nation's top milers (4:59.07), with Amber Parkinson leading a good Orange Lutheran (SS) squad. Neve Zwagerman (Tamalpais, Mill ValleyNCS) (2nd '89 Division II) had a super Section Finals race, with Amy Davidson (Bret Harte, Altaville-SJS) another high returnee at 4th place from Division III Last year.

The Division III boys race will feature a St. Ignatius (San Francisco-CCS) team that performed magnificently in their Section Finals. Mark McManus leads an underclass dominated Wildcat team that will be tough to beat. San Marion dropped nicely in the Southern Section Finals, with Peter Nichols and Carlos Deovando leading the Titans. Palos Verdes (SS) is also very solid, with junior Goss Lindsey a top individual for the Sea Kings. Palo Alto (CCS) was also very tough in the Section Championship affair at Crystal Springs Park. San Luis Obispo is strong, with James Menon (8:59.05 the #2 returning two-miler in the nation) and Adam Divirgilio very capable team leaders. Livermore (NCS) has Ahmik Jones leading the division's early season top-ranked squad. Placer (Auburn) was the Sac Joaquin Section Champion. Other top individuals here include Jeff Wilson (Newbury Park-SS), Ryan Bow (Lemoore-Cen), sophomore Jed Saueressig (Yosemite, Oakhurst-Cen), Aaron Kemp (San Lorenzo Valley, Felton-CCS), Austin Matulonis (Oak Ridge, El Dorado Hills-SJS), and Dan Stoll (College Park, Pleasant Hill-NCS).

The girls Division III team contest is led by a very tough La Jolla (SD) squad, the defending CIF/Reebok State Division II Champions, who are ranked 14th in the nation by "Harrier" magazine. Frosh Julie Schoene led a Viking charge in the Section Finals that scored 17 points and had the 1-5 gap at 33 seconds! San Marino (SS) will lead the challenge from the rest of the state, with a healthy Titan crew, led by Marjorie Hsu, capable of competing with La Jolla. Mills (Millbrae-CCS), second to La Jolla in Division II last year, has Diane Harlick and a good group here this weekend. St. Francis (Sacramento-SJS) had Cybelle McFadden take the Section divisional title, with Foothill (Santa Ana) the second best from the Southern Section, and St. Francis (Mountain View-CCS) putting together a fine Section Chamionship race. There are some other strong athletes in the field. Becky Spies (Livermore-NCS) is one of the nation's best, the state champion in track at 1600 meters (4:48.74), and runner-up Division I statewide in 1989 in cross country. Kate Sweeney (Leigh, San Jose-CCS), super frosh Carrie Garritson (Rim of the World, Lake Arrowhead-SS), defending CIF/Reebok State Division II Champion, Sarah Riley (Campolindo, Moraga-NCS), Becky Kaiser (Seaside, Monterey-CCS), and Tennya Soderman (Gunn, Palo Alto-CCS) will be factors up front.

The boys Division II run will feature very fierce competition. Season-long divisional top-ranked team, Del Camp (Fair Oaks), has a host of challengers. In the San Diego Section Finals, San Pasqual (Escondido), with team member Robert Walker racing the Section's fastest time for the day, handled a very strong Helis (SD) squad, led by Brazilian Daniel DasNeves and Javier Lozano (10th Division I 1989). Southern Section powers Agoura, third Division I in 1989, and Camarillo, the nation's top ranked boys team and CIF/ Reebok State Division I champions in 1989, are peaking strongly again this year. Agoura is led by sophomore Ryan Wilson and Mike Cherman, with Camarillo Sannon Brusca and Ken Gerry. Amador Valley (Pleasanton) continues to improve, edging the Jim Zachery led De La Salle (Concord) team in the North Coast Division II Finals. Gunderson (San Jose-CCS), led by James Joyner, and Shasta (No), with Chris Dawson on top, have been very successful in their area.

Preview Continued

Some good individuals will be near the front of the pack. Tesfaye Beyene (Newark Memorial-NCS) is having a super season, with Todd Tressler (San Marcos, Santa Barbar-SS) that Section's Champion. Hector Hernandez (Jar Vista, Imperial Beach-SD), Mark Gonzales (La Habra-SS 2nd last year Division II), last year's 8th placer Div. I Israel Pose (Torrance-SS), and James Pendergraph (Norte Vista, Riverside-SS 10th Div. II '89) rate solid consideration.

The girls Division II race has a San Pasqual (Escondido-SD) squad that returns most of a 1989 Division I third place team back racing very strong lately. Coach Will Wester's Golden Eagle squad gapped very close to leaders Deanna Hadley (11th Div. I '89) and Melissa Keim in the Section Finals, with the team deserving a rating among the top dozen nationally. Westlake (Westlake Village-SS) led by Jeannie Rothman (3rd '89 Div. I) and Jessica Graham, had a fine 98:16 team time at Mt. SAC in the Section Finals. Rothman's 17:25 earlier in the season on the Mt. SAC course is the equal number three time ever on that popular venue. Woodbridge (Irvine-SS) is led by talented frosh, Kay Nekota, with a young Canyon (Anaheim) team as improved as any in the state from the start of the season. Del Camp (Fair Oaks) was strong in the Sac Joaquin Finals, with El Capitan (Lakeside) packing nicely to earn the second spot out of the San Diego area. Some top individuals will be competing here. Shelley Taylor (Edison, Huntington Beach-SS 7th Div. I '89 and a fine 4:54.44/1600 meters from track), Milena Glusac (Fallbrook-SD 9th Div. I '89), Crissy Look (Shasta, Redding-No), Martha Pinto (Katella, Anaheim-SS 10:42.51 for 2nd in state over 3200 meters in track), Tanya Brix (University, Irvine-SS 4th Div. I'89), and Melissa Freeburg (California, San Ramon-NCS 13th Div. I'89) are back with very strong credentials. Laura Monson (Claremont-SS), Danielle Nelson (Napa-SJS), Heather Trout (Casa Roble, Orangevale-SJS), Judy Petty (Golden West, Visalia-Cen), and Elice Patterson (Castro Valley-NCS) had good Section Finals efforts.

The boys Division I features the team that has easily been the Golden State's finest in 1990. Madera, under Coach Dennis DeWitt, has rolled over everyone during a season of statewide travels, with the Coyotes a potent pack that gaps within 20 seconds near the front of big races. Ranked number three in the nation by Harrier magazine, Madera has Jose Santiago and Polo Duarte leading this year's benchmark of excellence against which all other programs in the state can measure themselves. Some strong squads have the talent to challenge Madera. Hart (Newhall-SS), led by soph. Keith Grossman and Billy Dixon, and Saddleback (Santa Ana-SS)

with Eddie Salinas, are squads of great ability that have one more chance to jell this season. Belmont (LA), led by Rene Arellano, scored a very low 32 points to take the Los Angeles City title. Bellarmine (San Jose) edged Watsonville in the Central Coast Section Finals run. Individually, the race will feature the nation's top prep harrier in Louie Quintanta (Arroyo Grande-SS 2nd '89 Div. I). The nation's top returning miler at 4:07.20, Quintana has been undefeated from coast to coast this Fall, including a 45 second thrashing of the top runners in the Virginia-Washington D.C. area at the University of Virgiania Invitational in late September. Louie raced 14:40 at Mt. SAC ealier this season, with an inspired effort here giving him a shot at the all-time course mark of 14:38 by Marc Davis (San Diego HS) from 1986. Dave Hartman (Canyon, Canyon Country), among the top half dozen in the nation, has been the only one to keep Quintana honest this season, pushing Louie with a 14:51 on the Mt. Sac course, with Dave having a fine 9:06.28 for 3200 meters on the track. Dan Niednagel (Dana Hills-SS) is another strong runner from the South. Others who will be near the front are Steve Guerrini (Santa Rosa-NCS), 1989 Division I 12th placer Steve Gonzales (Carson-LA), and Brian Godsey (Taft, Woodland Hills-LA).

Four of the girls Division I teams in today's meet are ranked among the top ten nationally by "Harrier" magazine (no other state has more than two ranked among the entire top 25 put out every two weeks during the Fall by that publication). The Division I girls race will feature the state's strongest squad, Agoura (SS), coached by Bill Duley, ranked second in the nation. The Chargers are ably led by Deena Drossin, one of the nation's top runners, and a two-time CIF/Reebok Division I champ. Drossin is the defending state 3200 meter champion in track twith a 10:29.60 best, and earlier this season equalled the course record at Mt. SAC (17:16). The Charger team does not stop with Drossin, as Tiffany York (12th '89 Div. I), Laura Hayward, Kristie Camp, and Skye Colclough lead a pack that raced 93:59 in the Southern Section Finals at Mt. SAC, the #5 team performance ever there. Mt. Carmel (San Diego) holds a #4 national ranking, with Susan Scott leading the Sun Devils to performances that included a solid trouncing of the top teams from the eastern U.S. in the Eastern States Championship race in the Manhattan College, (New York City) Invitational in mid-October. Palos Verdes has taken the only three CIF/Reebok State Division I girls championships awarded thus far, and is ranked #5 nationally. Coach Joe Kelly has nother fine squad, and he hopes to regroup the Sea Kings here at the end of the season behing Maya Muneno (21st '89 Div. I). Arroyo Grande, given a #10 ranking nationally, feature Angela Orefice (19th '89 Div. I) and Brandy Barr (20th '89 Div. I), with the Eagles adding to their national stature with a big win at the University of Virginia Invitational in late September. Irvine, with strong runners Kelly Roda and frosh Jennifer Gillis, has been a big surprise this season. Keeping the Southerners honest will be Clovis West (Fresno-Cen), led by Sarah Groff, and Overfelt (San Jose-CCS), led by Mario Solorio (10th Div. I '89). Veronica Barajas (Channel Islands, Oxnard-SS) raced a fine 17:47 on the tough Mt. SAC course behind Drossin in the Southern Section Finals, with Erica Sumi (Wilson, Long Beach-SS) third there. Mika Horn (Santa Rosa-NCS), Broooke Pritchard (Vacaville-SJS), and Asheligh Armstrong (San Dieguito, Encinitas-SDS) were strong in Section runs.

In addition, Quan is active in sports competing in varsity tennis and badminton at Pioneer High.

Quan was first encouraged to get involved in activities in the seventh grade by her sister Selina, who was always actively involved with one project or another. She was also encouraged by teachers, advisors, her brother and her parents to strive for her best and to be involved.

Quan would like to get into international business or pediatrics after college. She wants to attend either Stanford, UC Berkeley, UC Davis or Santa Clara University upon graduating from Pioneer this year.

"Involvement in my school definitely influences my everyday life. Sports, clubs and activities are all different facets which encourage me to give everything all my effort and to strive for the best.

"For me, school becomes much more enjoyable and memorable with activities. There's an old saying which I strongly believe - "in order to love life, one must live life.' This means in order for me to live my life to its fullest I must get involved and learn to love what I am.

"Participation in numerous events have helped me build my self esteem and confidence. My teachers used to complain about the fact that I was too shy, however, the situation is completely reversed now...High school only lasts for a few years in ones' lifetime and everyone should be able to enjoy it. In addition to academics, extra curricular activities is a crucial aspect. All participants become role models and they are the ones who will become the leaders of tomorrow. Everyone should strive to get involved in activities because they inspire you the rest of your life. Always strive for your goals and continue to dream and do."

Doug Speck Serves as Honorary Starter

A name that goes hand-in-hand with the sport of cross country in California is Doug Speck, who serves as the Honorary Starter for the 1990 CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Championships.

Currently a teacher at First Avenue Junior High School in Arcadia, Speck graduated from Eagle Rock High School in Los Angeles and attended both Pasadena City College and Cal Poly Pomona. He received his masters degree from Azusa Pacific.

In addition, he helped initiate a post-season "California State High School Cross Country Rankings" in 1982, with rankings done during the season since the the inception of the CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Championships in 1987. He served "The Athletic Congress" for the last three years as a consultant to juniors and has been involved with publicizing TAC/USA Junior National Championships in the sport of Track and Field.

His involvement with the CIF is numerous including serving on the ad hoc committee for cross country to study changes in number of divisions and enrollment breakdowns for the CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Championships. He has assisted with the section and state meets in track and field and section meets in cross country. Currently, Speck is on the Southern Section-CIF Cross Country Advisory Committee.

Speck has served as the meet director for the prestigious Arcadia Invitational, rated as the nation's top high school in season invitational meet. One of his high points in sports came at the 1984 Olympic Games, where he served as Field Event Facilities Coordinator with responsibility for equipment used in the field events at the Los Angeles Coliseum.

A resident of Glendora, Doug and his wife Kathy have two daughters, Kerri 19, and Jennifer 16. Kerri is a sophomore at USC, while Jennifer is a junior at Glendora High.
