While it was not a sensational day for individual runners at the Clovis Invitational, one team had something to brag about.

A quintet of underclassmen from Gunn offered an impressive collective showing and won the sophomore team title over the 3.1 mile course at Woodward Park in Fresno.

Gunn's team of four sophomores and a freshman scored 34 points to outdistance Madera and Jesuit — two of the strongest cross country programs in the state.

Gunn's victory in the sophomore classification was sparked by a fourth-place finish by Mark Tompkins, who covered the course in 17:32. Teammate Neal Harder was sixth (17:37); Matt Tompkins was eighth (17:50); and freshman Manuel Alegria and sophomore Grant Wayman were each clocked in 18:32 to give the Titans five finishers among the top 15.

Serra's Tom Washington was also in the top 15, finishing ninth in 17:58.

In the varsity-medium schools classification, Serra's Dan Boehle was eighth in 16:32. Gunn's varsity was ninth among the team finishers and Palo Alto was 18th.

In the girls competition, the locals gave a good showing in the medium schools race. Leading Gunn to a sixth-place team finish was sophomore Laurie Cook, who was ninth in 20:56. Palo Alto was ninth and paced by Janis Kim. who was 14th in 21:14.

Los Altos' Tracy Shoemaker was the top local finisher in the event, finishing fifth in 20:38.
