

Welcome to the 23rd edition of the Stanford Cross Country Invitational co-hosted by Palo Alto High School. The beautiful Stanford Golf Course will serve as the setting for seventeen races for high schools, colleges, and open competitors. At the conclusion of the day, almost four thousand athletes will have competed at the home of the Cardinal's men's and women's cross country teams.

A shady site covered with more than three hundred oak trees, the course is both picturesque and challenging. Just as rich as the scenery is the tradition of top flight cross country competition. Home of the NCAA District VIII Championships for six seasons and the Pac-10 Championships since 1972, the course has challenged some of the finest distance runners in the world.

In order for us to continue hosting an excellent cross country meet, your cooperation is needed in respecting the Stanford olf Course. Please stay off the greens, the and traps, and tees at all times, and do not disturb the horses located in the Stanford Barn.

Outstanding high school athletes from California, up and down the West Coast, and across the United States will race today over 3,000 meters for Junior Varsity squads and 5,000 meters for Varsity teams. In each J.V. race, awards will be presented to the top two teams and top ten individuals. The top four teams and fifteen individuals in the Varsity races will receive awards. The state of California has recently implemented five divisions for high school competition. Because of time constraints, Divisions IV and V will run together in the varsity races, although they will be scored separately for both individual and team awards.

In the late afternoon, some of the nation's finest collegiate runners will tackle the challenging course. The schools will represent each NCAA Division as well as a selection of NAIA, Junior and Community College Divisions. After the women's 5,000 meter races and men's 8,000 meter races, a special NON-team scored race will be held to enable a selection of open athletes to com-





High School Girls / Division I

The Girls Division I features Julia Stamps (Santa Rosa), former Foot Locker National Champion in the sport, finally a twelfth grader who will close chapters on a fabled prep career around the state each time she passes through the chute this Fall. With many of her goals international at this stage in her career, Julia is fresh off a late-August 11th place finish in the World Junior Championships in track over 3000 meters, as successful a finish in recent years by any American distance runner there. Find a good spot and marvel as the willowy star in the halloween colored uniform flies around the University golf course this day, romping to another fine effort.

The team aspect of this event has Bend (Oregon) under famed Coach Bob Latham, currently ranked 14th in the entire nation with momentum off of seven straight State 4A harrier titles. Sophomore Abby McAllister (2nd in the state), Allison Cowart (4th), and Amanda Nelson (7th) lead five scorers from the Lava Bear group that scored 30 points in the 1995 State Meet! However, here last year it was Clayton Valley (Concord) that took the title in Division I, with 49 points to Bend's 136. Clayton Valley ended the 1995 season ranked #7 in the entire nation (Bend was #18), with only one of the top six scorers from its 1995 State Division III runner-up group graduating. Deborah Osteen, Kelly Howisey, and Julie Leininger were inside the top twenty in their State Meet Division in 1995. Pick out these two schools and watch what should be an exciting team contest. Vista, out of the San Diego section, was fourth here last year.

Ayala (Chino Hills) is a highly ranked Southern Section team, with Jennifer Burris (7th in the state meet), a 4:54.0 1600m runner, leading. Chino's Jennifer Smith is a 10:57.37 3200m runner in track, with Jen Schindler (Ponderosa, Shingle Springs) the Division II winner her last year and 10:56.02 in track. Danielle Day (Quartz Hill) has run 10:45.20 in track, with sophomore Trina Cox adding to Santa Rosa's power with a 10:52.1 as a ninth grader. Chrisie Gregory (Clovis) was 15th in the state meet last fall, while Emili Lawson (Clovis West, Fresno) was 18th in that competition.

High School Boys / Division I

Very strong Northern California teams lead this division, with Bowling Green (Kentucky) an interesting out of state visitor. Nevada Union (Grass Valley), at twelfth, and Jesuit (Sacramento), eighteenth, are ranked very high nationally to start the 1996 season. Both had significant losses from very strong 1995 teams, but each had very impressive frosh/soph groups to draw from this year. Corey Creasy was 9:24.1 (3200m) in track for Nevada Union, with Kaapema Yelpaala 4:19.07 (1600m) and Jonathan Welsh 9:40.1 (3200m) for Jesuit. The above are mortal, with Jesuit suffering a defeat early on from De La Salle (Concord), with Foot Locker National Finalist Tom Prindiville still trying to get over injuries leading what could be a very strong De La Salle squad. Alex Sanchez is a 4:17 1600m runner for De La Salle. Bowling Green, Kentucky, ranked second statewide in the preseason, was the State 2A Champ last year, with Matthew Tabor (3rd in State 2A), Micah Salsman (5th), and Stuart Butler (14th) top returnees with an interesting national comparison from their result here. Ayala (Chino Hills) is highly rated in the Southern Section, with Chino and Arroyo (El Monte) potentially fine teams from that area. Andrew Wulf (4:14.2 1600m track) leads always tough Bellarmine Prep (San Jose), with Bend (Oregon) traditionally a top Oregon 4A power.

Some fine teams grace Division II, with Scripps Ranch (San Diego) second in the state meet last year, Buchanan (Clovis) sixth in that competition, and Valhalla (El Cajon) eighth there. All return strong groups on paper that look about a minute apart on the "team-time" chart heading into the 1996 season. Scripps has strong leaders Kristina Stasko, Emily McFarland, and Kelly Grimes (all among the top twer ty-five in their state division), while Buchanan offers Rachel Bauer, Tiffany Heilbut, and Cheren Douglas. Valhalla has Elaine Lassen and Kelly Halligan leading their squad. Katie Hotchkiss, a 5:07.80 1600m runner, leads what could be a good Mission San Jose (Fremont) group. Anne Gunnison (McClatchy, Sacramento) has shown great potential during a prep career that has her with 4:59.37 (1600m) and 10:51.37 (5th in the state at 3200m) for 1995 spring bests. Heather Shurtleff (West Hills, Santee) is off to a strong 1996 fall start, winning her race at 17:52 in the flat Woodbridge (Irvine) Invite.

KELLY BLAIR

This has been a busy summer for Kelly Blair.... In June, she had the upset of the year, defeating Jackie Joyner Kersee in the heptathlon by three points. Kelly's score-6406-was her personal best and the fourth best score ever by an American.

Kelly is one talented athlete. She played basketball and track in high school, earning all state honors in basketball her junior and senior years, and scored 5231 in the heptathlon. At the University of Oregon, Kelly found that two sports was too much. So, she redshirted from basketball and her heptathlon took off! In 1993, as a junior, Kelly won the NCAA title. In 1995, Kelly took tenth at the World Championships with a score of 6229!

In her second heptathlon in Atlanta, Kelly Blair watched her teammate Jackie Joyner Kersee retire from the heptathlon with an injury on the first day of competition. The next day, Kelly took eighth, with a score of 6307. As the first American heptathlete to finish in Atlanta, Kelly Blair is the Fuji/American Track & Field Notable Athlete for June 1996!


BOB KENNEDY

Thirteen Minutes. In 1982, when Dave Moorcroft ran 13:00.42, he held his face in his hands, shocked at the enormity of his performance. On July 8, 1996, Bob Kennedy found himself in fifth place at 3,000 meters in a 5,000 meter race. "I was running by myself in fifth. There were three Kenyans ahead of me but I kept the pressure on and moved into second with two laps to go," Bob recalls. Finishing second to Daniel Komen's 12:51.60, Bob's superb 12:58.75 gave him the American 5,000 meter record for the first time--breaking the eleven year old record of Sydney Maree.

On August 3, 1996, with 82,000-plus screaming fans, Kennedy took the lead of the Men's Olympic Final 5,000 meters with 800 meters to go. The crowd went crazy. He had kept the race fast for ten straight laps, staying just close enough to threaten to up the ante if anyone slowed the pace down, now he took his shot...After a furious last eight hundred meters, Kennedy took sixth, the best finish by an American since Steve Prefontaine's fourth in 1972.

How good is Bob Kennedy? As good as he wants to be. On August 10, Bob broke his own AR at 3,000 meters with a 7:33.96 in Nice. And, on August 14, Bob lowered the 5,000 meter record to 12:58.21. And on August 23, Bob lowered the 3,000 record to 7:31.96! Congratulations to America's greatest middle distance runner, Bob Kennedy, who takes on all comers and makes us proud, you are the Fuji/American Track & Field Notable Athlete for July 1996!

LANCE DEAL


The agony, and the ecstasy of Lance Deal

In the Hammer Throw final, an event won by four Hungarians since 1948, another young Hungarian, Balacz Kiss, continues the long and honorable tradition of Hungarian hammer throwers with two great throws over 80 meters--80.50 on his second and 81.24 on his third--266-6 to take the lead. Andrey Svaruk of Ukraine went 79.92 to get into second in his third throw, and our hero Lance Deal had two fouls--he was in definite trouble. Lance then pops a 76.94 meter throw, which ties him for eighth place and Lance thinks--it is over... He takes off his singlet, his shoes and most imporintly...his throwing gloves... The agony has hit. Lance tells us later, " I was shocked, I thought that it was over."

But, in championship finals, there is no count back for the final qualifier--Deal had three more throws! He still had a chance! He put on his singlet, his throwing gloves and changed to his "fast shoes"... Nothing changed in the hammer until round six.

Deal, was the first up in the rotation for round six. He went into the cage, looked up at the gate, and entered the ring. His technique was near perfection---his distance of 81.12 meters, or 266 feet two inches catapulted him into second place! He tried hard to relax, as eight more throwers had a chance to know him off the medal podium.

The ecstacy..Lance Deal, who looked to be out of the competition takes the silver medal! As the silver medalist, Lance Deal was the first American to medal in the hammer since 1956! Congratulations to Lance Deal as the 1996 Fuji/American Track & Field Notable Athlete award for August!
