Dear CCS League Representatives,

FIRST AND FOREMOST: The 2022 database of coaches available to us is rather incomplete so we ask you to PLEASE FORWARD THIS EMAIL TO YOUR FELLOW COACHES who have teams or individuals scheduled to compete Saturday at the CCS Cross Country Championships.

Coaches: attached you will find:

- The CCS Cross Country Information bulletin which includes a map of the course and locations of the main gate, the clerk of the course, etc.
- The meet schedule which includes the guidelines for qualifying for the CIF State Cross Country Championships
- The lane assignments
- From our Meet Referee a reminder: Team members are in the same uniform (predominant color is the key and matching shorts) and that each competitor wears their bib with the chip the entire race. The bib should not be altered in any way. (Note: It is recommended that athletes do not put on their bib until after warmups so that the bib does not get crumbled prior to the race). He has also provided the attached uniform rule pages from the NFHS rulebook.


Please also note the following:

- Crystal Springs Cross Country Course sits is adjacent to a residential neighborhood. Please be respectful of
 the residents. Do not block any driveways when parking and please ask your athletes and spectators to not
 leave any trash in the neighborhood nor in Hallmark Park. We are providing sufficient trash bins on the
 course.
- Please ask your athletes not to warm up or warm down in the neighborhood, nor on the competition race course (We have 10 races and we would like to insure that the competition is as pristine as possible for all races. Also, Record Timing will have equipment on the course that records "splits". Athletes who warm up wearing a bib and happen to be on the competition course could record an inadvertent split....another reason not to put on the bib prior to race time). There is plenty of warmup trails adjacent to the actual course.
- Team arrivals:

The gates will open at 8:30am As mentioned in the Information Bulletin: There is an admission charge for the CCS
Championships.

- All participants (in uniform) will be admitted at no charge.
- A maximum of three (3) alternates (in uniform) per team will be admitted at no charge.
- A maximum of four (4) coaches will be admitted (coaches will be asked to sign in at the main entrance. When the four spaces are filled on the sign-in sheet for a school, additional coaches from that school will be asked to purchase a ticket).
- Spectators: *Please share this with your parent community*. As noted in the Information Bulletin, only online tickets will be accepted. Online tickets are available through GoFan.com (https://gofan.co/app/events/758106?schoolId=CIFCCS).
- □ Coaches can register and receive their packets at the Clerk of the Course which will be located on the Northwest side of the course storage shed. Change forms will be available at that location for any teams that are making substitutions in their team lineup.
- Awards: Awards will be presented at the completion of each division. The awards area is located just to the north of the finish line.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL PARTICIPANTS AND COACHES:

The CIF-Central Coast Section is well aware that many other school and non-school activities (AP tests, SAT/ACT tests, proms, plays, holidays, senior trips, religious days, etc.) may occur during CCS Play-offs. The CCS tries to avoid as many conflicts as possible; however, with so many activities available for today's student-athlete, it is not reasonable to assume that all such activities can be taken into account, and thus, CCS Play-off events will go on as originally scheduled. Participants and coaches are therefore expected to plan in advance for such possible scheduling conflicts and make those difficult choices as to which events will take precedence for that individual. Generally, although it is ultimately the personal choice of the student-athlete and/or his/her parent(s), an academic activity should take precedence over an extra-curricular event.

CHECK-IN & SCORING PROCEDURE:

- The school coach must check in at the clerk of the course's table to pick up their Meet packets. This packet will include pre-assigned bibs with chips attached, safety pins and a course map. Please insure that runners do not crumple bibs. The bibs are to be worn on the front of the jersey.
- The school coach must be in attendance to check in their athlete and/or team and are expected to remain at
 the course throughout the race(s) in which their athlete and/or team competes. All student-athletes competing
 in any CCS contest must be accompanied by a coach that meets the criteria addressed in CCS and CIF
 Bylaws: NO COACH = NO COMPETE
 - MUST BE THE "REGULAR COACH
 - The coach of either a public or private school team or athlete must be the coach of record for that school for the current season and must comply with all requirements of CIF Bylaws.
 - PUBLIC SCHOOLS All public school teams must be coached by a person who meets the requirements of the California Education Code and the California Administrative Code Title V.
 - NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS In the case of a non-public school, a person engaged by that school on a
 yearly contract basis as a regular member of the school coaching or teaching staff and certified by the
 administrator for that school as competent for the position held.

- EMERGENCY SITUATIONS: In the case of an emergency ONLY, the Principal of the school may designate an alternate coach, as long as it is done in writing prior to the contest and submitted the CCS Commissioner for CCS Play-off contests. Any alternate coach MUST be an individual who meets all the conditions required in 3.-A.(1) above in the case of a public school; and 3.-A.(2) above in the case of a non-public school.
- The chip timing system will provide immediate results and identify qualifying teams and individuals to the State CIF Meet. A Lynx back-up system will also be used.
- Year and/or spelling corrections and substitution of a runner may be made at packet pick-up.
- The finish line will have mat-like sensors. The runners are to run across all mats and continue running approximately 10 feet beyond the last mat to where finish officials will be located. Once the runners have run past all the mats, they may disperse. They do not have to stay in finish order.
- Coaches are reminded to stay away from the finish line as their athletes finish -- WE NEED YOUR
 COOPERATION!
- In case of tied teams, the tie shall be broken by comparing the 6th-place finishers of the tied teams.

EMERGENCY FORMS/EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE

College of San Mateo, the managing body of the Crystal Springs Course requires that **each athlete have a hard** paper copy of their medical release which is signed by a parent or guardian and in their coaches' possession at the Central Coast Section Championships <u>Electronic medical forms are not acceptable</u>. Coaches will be required to provide proof of possession of their athletes' medical release forms during the check in procedure. Schools not in compliance will not be allowed to compete.

Medical care will be available for emergencies only. Athletic trainers will be on the course to respond to injuries or medical emergencies during races All medical emergencies should be referred to them. The trainers will NOT be available for taping or massaging of athletes.

PRE-MEET / WARMING UP:

Jogging the course prior to the Meet is permitted. The course must be cleared and will be closed to warm-ups prior to the start of the first race. Warm-Up areas will be available, as designated by the Meet Director. For safety reasons, the Belmont Police Department has asked that athletes not be allowed to warm-up or warm-down in the neighborhood adjacent to the course.

STARTING POSITION:

- Starting positions for the individuals and teams will be determined by random drawing.
- A double starting line, with a 5-yard separation, will be used. Three (3) runners from each team will line up on the front line of the starting box, and the remaining team members will line up on the second line.

COURSE CONDUCT:

- Please stay out of the fenced-off areas.
- o There is an EXTREME fire hazard in this area, and SMOKING is prohibited.
- o PETS (leashed or unleashed) ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE COURSE.
- BICYCLES ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE COURSE (except for medical personnel).
- Each team is responsible for cleaning up the area it has occupied during the day.
- o Radios, frisbees or footballs should not be taken onto the course.
- Throwing rocks and/or other similar types of objects is prohibited.
- o Coaches & athletes are reminded to stay out of the scoring area.
- All spectators and coaches must stay behind the ropes and/or chalk markings. Do not assist your runners on the course by running with them. This is considered unsportsmanlike and puts runners in jeopardy of disqualification.
- COACHES MUST STAY OFF THE RUNNING COURSE.

TEAM ENCAMPMENTS & TEAM MEMBERS' PERSONAL BELONGINGS

Team Encampments are available throughout the course on a first come basis. The clerk of the course will provide you with a trash bag for clean up. We are guests at Crystal Springs and leaving this venue better than we found it is both an expectation and a requirement. Neither the CCS, nor the host site is responsible for your team member's personal property. Teams should NOT assume that there will be "full time" supervision of team areas; therefore, it is incumbent upon teams to make their own arrangements for safeguarding their personnel's valuables. We strongly recommend that you do not leave ANY valuables (especially electronics) unattended while on the course. If you do so, you are doing so at your own risk.

DRONES

To insure the safety of runners, coaches, officials and spectators, CCS Policy prohibits the use of drones at all CCS events.

AWARDS

An awards ceremony will take place IMMEDIATELY after the conclusion of the girls race of each division. To be a participant in this ceremony, please make sure your athletes are at the awards area ASAP after the race.

- TEAM AWARDS Trophies for champion & runner-up. Medals to each member of the championship
- INDIVIDUAL AWARDS Individual medals 1st through 7th runner for each division
- PARTICIPANT CERTIFICATES are available for coaches and athletes on the CCS Cross Country page of the CCS website.

PRACTICE AT CHAMPIONSHIP SITE:

Practice at the championship site must be in accordance with the Crystal Springs policies and guidelines.

SPORTSMANSHIP:

- Each Principal is required by the CCS Board of Managers to meet with any individual and/or team from his/her school participating in the CCS Tournament to review the PRE-GAME SPORTSMANSHIP MEETING INFORMATION SHEET which can be found on the CCS Cross Country webpage.
- Any player or coach who is disgualified from a Tournament contest for flagrant misconduct or unsportsmanlike behavior shall be disqualified from all remaining contests in that sport that season, including the State CIF Championships.



Any visible garment(s) worn underneath the uniform top and/or bottom considered a foundation garment. Foundation garments are not subect to logo/trademark/reference or color restrictions.

Head coverings worn for religious reasons are not considered hair devices and must not be made of abrasive, hard or unyielding materials; and must be secured to the body and/or uniform.

ART. 2 . . . Additional restrictions for relay teams and cross country teams.

a. All relay and cross country team members must wear uniforms clearly indicating, through predominant color, school logo and color combination of all outer garments worn as a uniform, that members are from the same team. NOTE: The official should be able to observe that all members are from the same team.

PENALTY: (Articles 1, 2) For the wearing of an illegal uniform, when a violation is observed and noted by a meet official, the competitor shall be required to make the uniform legal before becoming eligible for further competition, and serving meet official, and the referee shall then notify or cause to be notified the shall be issued a warning that a subsequent violation shall result in a disqualilication from the event. The referee shall be notified of the violation by the obhead coach of the offending school of the competitor's violation and warning.

ART. 3 . . . Removing any part of the team uniform, excluding shoes, while in the area of competition, as defined by the games committee, is illegal

PENALTY: This shall lead to a warning and if repeated, to disqualification from the event. If the incident recurs, the competitor will be disqualified from further competition in the meet.
