"RUN THE BOULEVARD" ROAD RACE RESULTS

Chicago...Over 1800 people participated in the Chicago Bank of Commerce's second annual "RUN THE BOULEVARD" 12 kilometer (7.4 mile) road race on Sunday, October 30. The race featured a course throughout the downtown Chicago area and was the last race on the Chicago Area Runners's Association (CARA) circuit. Governor James B. Thompson and Mayor Harold Washington proclaimed October 30, 1983 as "RUN THE BOULEVARD DAY" in honor of the Chicago Bank of Commerce's contributions to the city, local athletes and the U.S. Olympic Track and Field Team.

<u>David Walters</u>, 28, (Paducah, Ky.) won the event with a time of <u>35.10</u>, breaking last year's record by 1.45. Walters, a Pilot for Air Illinois, is a former All American from the University of Illinois, holding state championship titles in the cross country and two mile events.

As expected, <u>Sarah Linsley</u>, 27, (Chicago) easily placed first in the women's division with a time of <u>40.06</u>. Linsley, the top midwest woman runner, shaved 4.32 off last year's record. Currently studying law at Northwestern, Linsley recently qualified for the U.S. Olympic Marathon Trial with a time of 2:37.56 in her first marathon attempt.

Of special interest was blind runner Michael Holmes, 28, (Chicago) who completed the course with a time of 55.29. Anne Clarke, 74, (Glen Ellyn) was the oldest runner and posted a time of 1:07.02. The Chicago Bank of Commerce's CEO Robert Williams, 39, completed the course in 52.45 and helped the bank place fourth in the corporate category. Identical twins Margaret and Melinda Power, 30, (Chicago) were the last two runners to finish by crossing the line together in 1:30.

In the Halloween spirit, runners costumed as vampires, bunnies, bumble bees, and Batman completed the course along with the smallest runner, an 11 year old dog named Elvis.
