## 1991 Run to the Stars 8K/3K Review

Thank you, thank you is all I can say to those 471 entrants who helped make the first annual Run to the Stars 8K/3K a huge success. Our major sponsor RE/MAX Silicon Valley was there to lend their help both financially and physically by supplying volunteers to aide as course marshals and general-all-around-help. Now on to the races.

The Bay Area Corporate Athletic Association (BACAA) made our race an official part of their Grand Prix Series, and we had over 100 runners representing their corporate teams. This really helped boost participation and competition for the winning teams.

The 8K race was shaping up to be a real battle based on pre-registration but when Charles Alexander of Hewlett-Packard showed up on race day... at the sound of the gun, a pack of four; Alexander, Eddie Lanzarin (Pac\*Tel), Brock Hinzmann (SRI) and Paul French (HP) set the pace. It was at the half mile mark when Alexander decided to push the tempo a bit and only Lanzarin responded to the surge. The first mile was hit at 4:50 and 4:54 respectively, with Hinzmann and French going through at 5 flat while watching the race up front. By two miles Alexander was continuing to open up a gap on second and French was feeling the pace. At the finish we saw Alexander winning in a time of 24:23, Lanzarin second, Hinzmann third, HP teammate French fourth and newly acquired Tod Parker of PacTel in fifth. Eight out of the top ten finishers were BACAA runners.

In the women's race Karen Rowan (who had just won the Tortoise and the Hare 10K the week before) followed the lead of the men's winner and led from start to finish with a finishing time of 30:08 for a 6:03 per mile average. Newly turned Master Maureen Luca of Bank of America had to out-kick her competition to take a second in 32:32 compared to 32:35 for Ingrid Rabe who finished in third. Don't think that the race for a second ended there; both Yudelia Guerrero (32:36) and Sherri Laudenslager (32:42) were in hot pursuit for the runner-up spot.

First Masters Man was Robert Parks of PacTel with a 28:03 time, good enough for 11th place overall. Maureen Luca (see above) won the Women's Masters. First Seniors were George Miller of Lockheed (31:36) and Doerte Murray (36:40). The team scoring was PacTel walking off with the top position in the Emphasis Division (Masters, which is worth DOUBLE points in the BACAA Grad Prix scoring) and Lockheed winning the women's side of the race.

The band (The Upbeats) continued to play those oldies but goldies. The prize drawing continued until the last of the diehards also finally received something. Everyone was talking about next year and how the event could continue to grow. We, the Race Committee, extend our thanks to all those who competed and we do hope to see you next year at the SECOND Annual Run to The Stars.
